1. Transmitted herewith is the Unit History of the 103d Quartermaster Company, 103d Infa ntry Division, APO 470, US Army, dated from 1 January 1945 to 31 January 1945, according to Un-numbered Memorandum, Headquarters 103d Infa ntry Division, da ted 11 November 1944.

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NARRATIVE

<u>1 Jan to 16 Jan.</u> The company welcomed the new year from their location at Norhange (370200). During the first half of the month very little excitement or activity was offered to the company. The handling of Division supplies was carried on in routine manner. After two months experience in combat the company was operating with very few hitches and Division as a whole seemed pleased with our service.

Accidents are bound to happen when a company operates fifty (50) vehicles upwards of 70000 miles per month. Fortunately we had only one serious accident up to 9 January. On that date we suffered our second one, serious enough to cause the driver to be hospitalized and the vehicle to be evacuated.

During the period, the Army supply dumps were near, with the exception of Class II which was still located at Epinal (079004). Army's Class I dump was located at Hampont (151269) and Class III at Sarrebourg (500155).

On the night of 14 January, the company was put on the alert after being notified that German paratroopers were in our general vicinity. The Company Commander doubled the area guard and had all automatic weapons so situated that all available routes of approach were covered. The men felt sure that we would be attacked and inwardly hoped so. However the following morning the alert was called off and we again found ourselves Quartermaster men - drawing and issuing supplies.

January 16th brought about several changes in the company. Captain Allen E. Shollenberger, QMC, 0395925, 1st Lt. Chester H. Porter, CMC, 01310301, 2nd Lt. John D. Noonan, CMC, 01594362 and 2nd Lt. James B. Scherer, CMC, 01590158, were promoted to Major, Captain and 1st Ltg respectively. The greatest thrill was derived from the field commission of one of our section Sergeants: Sgt Guy E. Romero, ASN 17071626. He was given his commission in the Infantry and left the company with the knowledge that every officer and man was behind him and knew that he would do as excellent a job in the Infantry as he had done in our company.

<u>16 Jan to 21 Jan.</u> On the morning of the 16th, the company received orders to move in conjunction with the Division moving from one sector to another. The CO received orders to move all dumps and the company to Ettendorf (888239), a move of about 63 miles. Class I, II, and III started rolling just as soon as was possible after the order was received.

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NAFRATIVE CONT'D

At Ettendorf (888239), the railroad station which we left nearly a month before, again became our home. All the dumps, as well as the CP and CDQM, were located at the station. The space wasn't adequate but all functions were carried out with as little confusion as possible.

A new member joined the company on the 18th - 2nd Lt. Fred C. Webster, QMC, 01594550. At Ettendorf (888239), the Division Quartermaster, Major George H. Schafer, QMC, 0396946, rejoined the company after being with Forward Echelon since entering combat. With the Major rejoining the company, the whole company was together once again, with exception of enlisted men on Detached Service. It helped the morale of the company to know that the Major was with the company again and that now would be able to see that he had the finest Quartermaster Company in the whole ETO.

On Saturday, 20 January we got orders to move again. It was a Corps' move and all the roads were crowded. The roads were icy and gave the trucks plenty of trouble. An advance detail left at 1400 with instructions that the company would close in by 0730 the following morning. Phalsbourg (648189) was the new location for the company and the Division dumps. The advance detail had locations ready at Phalsbourg by 1530 and at 1600 the first truck with supplies arrived. The trucks continued to arrive all night and at 0730, 21 January, the company was closed in. It was the fastest move the company had made since entering combat and was the best executed. It required full cooperation of the company and the men did all in their power to see that everything worked out well.

21 Jan to 31 Jan. The last week of the month there was nothing of interest other than our routine functions.

The month of January was a quiet month for the company but it was an important one for the Division. The Division Commander, Major General Haffner, who took command of the Division at activation, organized and trained us into a fighting combat Division, who led us through our first three months of combat, and on into Germany with the honor of being the first Division of 7th Army to cross the German border, was relieved of his command because of poor health. Brigadier General McAuliffe, the commander of the 101st Airborne Division at Bastogne, became the new Division Commander.

We know that the Division's combat efficiency was excellent under the Command of General Haffner and feel that it will continue to add praise and respect to its name under the able Command of General McAuliffe.



NARRATIVE

1 February to 28 February. During the month of February, the Company had very little unusual activity. We spent the entire month in Phaslbourg (648189), having moved in the latter part of January. The daily functions of the Company - drawing and issuing rations, gas and clothing - were carried out with no complications. Army Class II dump which was located at Epinal (079004) moved to Sarreburg (500155). This grouped all Army supply dumps within ten miles of the Company location and the Division Quartermaster supply points.

Throughout the month, taking advantage of the fine location and good weather, we instituted a recreational program. A volley-ball court was constructed, footballs and baseballs were drawn from the supply room and the men participated in physical conditioning and recreation during their free time.

The Company I & E officer, after returning from the school at Paris, started classes in music, German and French, in addition to his regular orientation classes. The men cooperated and attended all classes with enthusiasm.

The CO began an all out drive on first echelon maintenance by forming inspection teams in each truck platoon whose duty it was to make a complete inspection of one of their platoon vehicles each day. The inspection team was composed of the two section Sgts and the four squad leaders under the supervision of the platoon Sgt and Platoon leader. Although the vehicles were not in bad condition before these inspection teams were formed, it did, however, make the drivers alert and do a more thorough first echelon job daily.

One highlight of the social activity of the Company was a dance held in Phalsbourg (648189). We were fortunate in obtaining the services of the Division orchestra and the presence of thirty beautiful French girls. Everyone had a grand time despite the fact the men and girls had a difficult time understanding one another.

A plan was set up for the town, under the control of the 14th Armored Division. Our part in the plan was a defense platoon, to defend the three roads coming into town. Road blocks were constructed and a plan formulated to locate our bazookas and .50 Cal. Machine Guns and thepositions to be taken up by defense personnel.

During the month of February, because of the more or less inactive tactical situation, the men were becoming restless. They liked the location but believed that by remaining in the same spot for a month, they weren't contributing to bringing the war to a speedy end. They all crave activity, and hope that the month of March will see the Division on the move- on the move towards Berlin!



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NARRATIVE

March 1945 will remain foremost in the minds of the men of the 103d Quartermaster Company. It was during March that the company followed the fighting infantry through the Siegfried line into Germany.

March 1 to March 12: During this period the company did very little in addition to its normal Quartermaster functions. We had now been in Phalsbourg (648189) for nearly two months and "Camp" Phalsbourg seemed like home.

Inspections of quarters, vehicles, installations and offices were held daily with formal inspections on Saturday. However, the men were restless and wanted to start moving again. It was hard to make them understand that these halts are common during any tactical operation. Passes to Paris and Brussels were frequent and the anticipation of receiving one kept morale high.

<u>March 13 to March 18</u>: We received orders to move north of Phalsbourg and on the other side of the Saverne Gap on the morning of the 13th. The Bouxwiller railroad station (815250) was chosen as the location to operate all Division Quartermaster installations. Adequate space was found here to carry out all duties and functions without difficulty.

The drivers and the maintenance section worked hard keeping the vehicles up to division standards, as the trucks were on the road continuously. Rations, gasoline, oil and clothing were handled without mishap. No complaints were received from any of the division units.

March 19 to March 24: On March 19 we moved into the railroad station at Woerth (006376). All sections moved into the same areas they had occupied about three months previous.

During this period the infantry set a fast pace, nevertheless we kept them well supplied at all times. On the 21st, Class I and III points were opened at Lembach (237448) to facilitate the drawing of these supplies by forward elements. On the 25th these points were moved forward to Birchenhardt, Germany (140573) - our first supply point in Germany. This move was necessary to keep on the heels of the infantry.

The reserve rations and gasoline were moved from Woerth to Wissembourg (155482) on the 23rd, closing out these dumps at Woerth. While unloading that night at Wissembourg, the new dump was shelled by German artillery.

For a long hour all personnel were pinned to the ground. One of the men was hit and was evacuated to the rear. This made the company's fourth Purple Heart.

March 25 to March 28: On the 25th the company moved again, but this move was quite different than any ever made before - we crossed the Siegfried line into Germany, entered an enemy country, and had a chance to see just why the Germans consider themselves "Supermen". The company moved into the railroad station at Ingenheim (248396). This same day the Birchenhardt installations were moved forward to Klingen-Munster (208604). The company C.P. and Division Quartermaster office were now farther forward than either the Division C.P. or our forward dumps. The next day the Klingen-Munster dump was moved up with the company. The Wissembourg dumps, which were never used, were also moved to Ingenheim. During this entire operation the trucks rolled day and night. This left little or no chance for inspections, however, the drivers performed their 1st Echelon duties faithfully. Although everyone worked day and night keeping the supplies close to the fighting units, morale in the company stayed high.

<u>March 29 to March 31</u>: The organization made only one move during this period. On the 29th we moved to Schifferstadt (460870), still closer to the Rhine. Here a little trouble was encountered, in that orders were received to move into the railroad station while another Quartermaster company was still there. Everything smoothed out, however, when the other company moved out the following day.



NARRATIVE

<u>April 1:</u> On this date the company and all its installations were located at Schifferstadt (460870). Class I, II and III, all operating smoothly, were in the immediate vicinity.

April 2 to April 7: April 2nd we received orders to move the company and all dumps west to the railroad station at Neustadt (295834). Adequate space for offices, quarters and installations was found. The area, however, had been left in such poor condition by its previous occupants that two days labor by thirty (30) PW's was necessary to make it fit for occupancy. On April 6th a number of changes in officer assignments were made. Captain Milford L Sanford, 0386971, QMSO, was sent on DS to Sixth Army Group. Captain Chester H Porter, 01310301, Company Commander, was designated QMSO in the absence of Captain Sanford. 1st Lt. Edmund J Fleming, 01310431, was designated Company Commander in the absence of Captain Porter.

April 8 to April 18: On April 8th, the company and all installations crossed the Rhine river and moved to the railroad station at Heppenheim (650160) without mishap. This area was excellent for a Quartermaster company. During this period the Division was in Army reserve. The Quartermaster company, however, worked harder than ever getting vehicles into shape after the hard use they had received coming up through the Siegfried line.

While in this area all officers and men stood reveille and retreat. Twenty (20) minutes close order drill was held each morning immediately after reveille.

April 10th was a dark day at the 103d Quartermaster company. Pfc Troy L Bearden, 34573100, driver and member of the 1st truck platoon was killed. Pfc Bearden had driven his truck to the Army gas dump at Friedrichsfeld (6194) to draw gas for the division. He was sitting at the wheel of his truck when he suddenly slumped over, shot through the neck. The shot is believed to have come from the rifle of one of a number of colored soldiers who were hunting rabbits in the near vicinity. All members of this command feel they have lost one of the finest men the Quartermaster company ever had.

The remainder of our stay in Heppenheim was spent performing normal Quartermaster functions.

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NARRATIVE CONTINUED

April 19 to April 21: April 19th saw the company on the move again, this time to a very small country town - Windischenbach (273600). Quarters were not available for personnel, so for the first time since we left Marseille the company was bivouaced in the field.

At this time the infantry started their final race through Germany, and we all knew there was plenty of hard work ahead. All trucks were used for gasoline and rations. The only time the trucks stopped was to change drivers, which wasn't often. Army dumps were over sixty (60) miles away, and this long supply line made it difficult to keep the division supplied. However, the untiring efforts of all concerned kept adequate supplies on hand.

April 21 to April 23: The company moved to Kirchheim (260060) on the 21st. All installations moved except Class II which remained in Windischenbach. The company carried bed rolls and musette bags only, leaving all excess equipment with Class II. As usual the company was located in a railroad station.

Our maintenance section did a fine job in keeping the trucks rolling. Tires were our biggest difficulty now, so crews worked 24 hours a day repairing the tires to keep the trucks rolling. We were hauling gas and rations over ninety (90) miles. This made it necessary for our trucks to be on the road 24 hours a day.

April 24 to April 26: On April 24th the company moved to Geislingen (550050), one of the best areas we ever had. Again it was a railroad station we occupied. Both Class I and III had ample room for operation and the men were quartered in the railroad hotel. The morale of the men was high in this area. The kitchen was located in the hotel restaurant table cloths and china were used.

April 26th word was received at the CP that there were a number of heavily armed German soldiers in a house on a near by hill. A twenty (20) man patrol was formed and set off to investigate. As the men were surrounding the house, Tec 5 Paul A Staples, 36547945, was shot and wounded in the left hip by rifle fire. This was the only casualty. Twelve (12) prisoners were captured and taken to the nearest enclosure, and a suspected Gestapo agent was turned over to C.I.C.

<u>April 27:</u> On the morning of the 27th an advanced ration and gas dump was established in Nersingen (765841), so that fast advancing infantry would not have to go so far to the rear to draw supplies. The afternoon of the 27th the company moved to Krumbach (950640), where gas and ration dumps were installed. During the night another gas dump was set up in Mindleheim (050420).

<u>April 28 to April 29:</u> The company and all dumps moved to the railroad station at Schongau (367175) the morning of the 28th. At this time we received word from G-4 that we could use any captured truck we could obtain to haul gasoline. We immediately put five into use, helping immeasurably.

<u>April 30:</u> On the last day of the month we moved to Garmisch-Partenkirchen (538830). All installations were located at the railroad station where sufficient space was to be had.

The month closes with the Quartermaster company working very hard, Army supply dumps being over 145 miles away. All drivers and mechanics were working 24 hours a day keeping the trucks on the road.

NARRATIVE

May 1 to May 3: The first of May saw the Division still engaged in the greatest drive it had ever known. The Quartermaster Company worked untiringly getting the supplies to the fighting men.

The company and all installations had been located in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany (538830) since 30 April. Class II and salvage moved there after having been in Windischenbach, Germany (273600) for almost two weeks. We were still drawing class I and III from a point over a hundred miles away.

May 4: The company and all supply installations moved across the Alps toward Innsbruck, Austria (773582). The class I and III dumps were established in Innsbruck. The company and remaining installations moved to a grain warehouse on the western outskirts of Hall, Austria (850605) - seven miles

It was while we were in this area that the war was over for the 103d Infantry Division. The men of the Quartermaster Company knew our job was complete, however celebration was at a minimum for they realized a big job was still ahead. We had all looked forward to V-E day with high anticipation. When the big day finally came however, a feeling of anti-climax prevailed, and V-E day passed much as any other.

May 5: The company moved to a better location on the east side of Hall into a former German Army post. Adequate space for all the company was to be had in the confines of this small post. The area was ideal, because of the great amount of work we knew was ahead. All vehicles and equipment were much in need of maintenance and repair.

<u>May 6 to May 10:</u> On the sixth of the month class I and III dumps moved from Innsbruck to the former German Army post in Hall where the rest of the company was located. After this last move all the company and its installations were together except class II and salvage. These installations remained in the grain warehouse west of Hall.

After moving into this area we began to draw rations and gasoline from Garmisch-Partenkirchen a distance of approximately forty (40) miles.

NARRATIVE CONTINUED

The company is carrying on its normal functions of supplying the Division with gasoline, rations, clothing, equipment and transportation. This was our job in war and it changes little with the coming of peace in Europe.

The company has been performing its normal functions of supplying the division with rations, gasoline, clothing and equipment. Clothing and equipment is drawn at Mannheim, Germany (520971), a distance of approximately 400 miles. Rations and gasoline are drawn at Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany (538830).

Normally the company is engaged in functional duties only six days a week. A double issue of gasoline and rations are drawn on Friday of each week from the Army dump. A double issue is made to the division on Saturday in order that the dumps may be closed on Sunday.

A training schedule is conducted six days a week. It includes a two hour I & E lecture to every member of the organization.

During this period neither problems nor difficulties were encountered.


