

1 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000.  
 Company "A": Oggersheim, Germany WR 4699, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000. Received and evacuated 4 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.  
 Company "B": Neuhofen, Germany WR 5091, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000. Received and evacuated 3 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.  
 Company "C": Waldsee, Germany WR 5188, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000. Received 9 casualties and evacuated 8 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.  
 Company "D": Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000. Received 29 casualties, evacuated 26, returned to duty 5, and remaining 53.

2 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Gardenstadt-Hochfeld WR 4895.  
 Company "A": Worms, Germany WM 4314, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000. Departed Oggersheim, Germany at 0630 and traveled 12 miles to arrive at Worms, Germany at 0745 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Received and evacuated 9 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.  
 Company "B": Landau, Germany WR 2867, Wissembourg Sheet V-2, Central Europe Map 1:100,000. Company moved by motor from City of Neuhofen, Germany to City of Landau, Germany. Departed old location at 1625, traveled a distance of 36 miles and arrived at Landau, Germany at 1722. Collecting station in operation at 1745. Morale of troops excellent. Received 3 casualties, returned to duty 1 and evacuated 2 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.  
 Company "C": Oggersheim, Germany WR 4699, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, 1:100,000. Closed Station in Waldsee, Germany at 0930. Company moved by motor convoy to Oggersheim, Germany arriving at 1035. Station in operation at 1050. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.  
 Company "D": Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895. Received 19 casualties, evacuated 20, returned to duty 8, and remaining 48.

3 - 6 April: Hq & Hq Det: Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895.  
 Company "A": Worms, Germany WM 4314. Received 137 casualties and evacuated 134 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta during this period.  
 Company "B": Landau, Germany WR 2867. Received 51 casualties and evacuated 50 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta during this period.  
 Company "C": Oggersheim, Germany WR 4699. Received and evacuated 48 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta during this period.

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3 - 6 April (Cont'd): Company "D": Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895. Received 250 casualties, evacuated 209, and returned to duty 27 during this period. On 6 April there were 62 casualties remaining in the Clr Sta.

During this period many of the casualties received and evacuated were German prisoners of war and civilian casualties.

7 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895.

Company "A": Rossdorf, Germany WM 7340, Frankfurt, Germany Sheet T-3, I:100,000. Departed Worms, Germany at 1415 and traveled 35 miles to arrive at Rossdorf, Germany at 1630 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Roads good. Weather excellent. Morale of troops excellent. Received and evacuated 17 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Schriesheim, Germany WR 6797, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, I:100,000. Company moved by motor from Landau, Germany to Schriesheim, Germany. Left old site at 1930, traveled a distance of 48 miles and arrived at Schriesheim, Germany at 2300. Received and evacuated 4 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Furth, Germany WM 7517, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, I:100,000. Closed station at Oggersheim, Germany at 1200. Company moved by motor convoy leaving old area at 1558 and arrived at Furth, Germany at 1800. Station in operation 1820. No casualties received.

Company "D": Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany WR 4895. Received 36 casualties, evacuated 25, returned to duty 7, and remaining 66.

8 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Bensheim, Germany WM 6321, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, I:100,000. Moved by motor march a distance of 30 miles from Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany to Bensheim, Germany M635215. Left old area 1230 and arrived at Bensheim, Germany at 1330. Weather clear. Roads excellent.

Company "A": Rossdorf, Germany WM 7340. No casualties received.

Company "B": Schriesheim, Germany WR 6797. Received and evacuated 3 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Furth, Germany WM 7517. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Bensheim, Germany WM 6321, Mannheim, Germany Sheet U-3, I:100,000. 2nd Platoon left area in Gardenstadt-Hochfeld, Germany at 1300, traveled 25 miles and set up station in Bensheim, Germany at 1600. Received 25 casualties, evacuated 20, returned to duty 5, and remaining 66.

9 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Bensheim, Germany WM 6321.

Company "A": Steinau, Germany WN 2391, Fulda, Germany Sheet S-4, I:100,000. Departed Rossdorf, Germany at 0830 and traveled 65 miles to arrive at Steinau, Germany at 1145 where Collecting Station set up. Roads good. Morale of troops excellent. Received 1 casualty and returned to duty 1.

Company "B": Schriesheim, Germany WR 6797. Received and evacuated 11 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

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9 - April (Cont'd): Company "C": Eberstadt, Germany WM 6535, Frankfurt, Germany Sheet T-3, 1:100,000. Closed old station at Furth, Germany at 0900. Company moved by motor convoy at 1015 and arrived at Eberstadt, Germany at 1120. Station in operation 1140. Received and evacuated 1 casualty to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Bensheim, Germany WM 6321. 1st Platoon left old area at Gerdensdt-Hochfeld, Germany and joined 2nd Platoon in Bensheim, Germany at 1400. Received 21 casualties, evacuated 14, returned to duty 10, and remaining 63.

10 - 18 April: Hq & Hq Det: Bensheim, Germany WM 6321.

Company "A": Steinau, Germany WN 2391. Received 78 casualties and evacuated 69 during this period.

Company "B": Schriesheim, Germany WR 6797. Received and evacuated 67 casualties during this period.

Company "C": Eberstadt, Germany WM 6535. Received and evacuated 79 casualties during this period.

Due to the great distance the collecting companies were from the Clearing Station during this period many of the casualties received were not evacuated to the 103d Inf Div Clr Sta but direct to other Clearing Stations in their vicinity or in the more serious cases direct to Field Hospitals and Evacuation Hospitals.

Company "D": Bensheim, Germany WM 6321. Received 295 casualties, evacuated 231, returned to duty 61 during this period. On 18 April there were 64 casualties remaining in the Clr Sta.

19 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Bensheim, Germany WM 6321.

Company "A": Steinau, Germany WN 2391. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Scheppach, Germany WS 2264, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor from City of Schriesheim, Germany to City of Scheppach, Germany. Left old site at 1720, traveled a distance of 60 miles and arrived at new site at 2045. Collecting Station set up in operation at 2100. Roads very good. Weather clear. Morale of troops excellent. Received and evacuated 3 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Eberstadt, Germany WM 6535. Received and evacuated 11 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Bensheim, Germany WM 6321. 1st Platoon left area in Bensheim, Germany, traveled approximately 83 miles and set up station in vicinity of Neuenstein, Germany at 1800. Received 43 casualties, evacuated 37, returned to duty 9, and remaining 61.

20 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Neuenstein, Germany WS 3367, Ellwange, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Left Bensheim, Germany at 0900 and traveled by motor march a distance of 83 miles to Neuenstein, Germany WS 337677.

Company "A": Steinau, Germany WN 2391. Received and evacuated 2 casualties to 11th Evacuation Hospital.

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20 - April (Cont'd): Company "B": Welzheim, Germany WS 3832, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor from City of Scheppach, Germany to City of Welzheim, Germany. Left old site, traveled a distance of 43 miles and arrived at Welzheim, Germany at 2340. Pitched tents and set up Collecting Station by 2400. Morale of troops excellent. Received and evacuated 4 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Sulzbach, Germany WS 2946, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Closed Collecting Station at Eberstadt, Germany at 0900. Left area at 1215. Company moved by convoy and arrived at Sulzbach, Germany at 1940. Station in operation at 2000. Received 2 casualties and evacuated 1 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Neuenstein, Germany WS 3367, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. 2nd Platoon closed station at Bensheim, Germany at 1800. Received 10 casualties, evacuated 14, returned to duty 6, and remaining 51.

21 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Murrhardt, Germany WS 3545, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Moved by motor march from Neuenstein, Germany at 0830 and traveled 25 miles to arrive at Murrhardt, Germany at 1230.

Company "A": Michelau, Germany WS 3230, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Departed Steinau, Germany at 1115 and traveled 150 miles to arrive at Michelau, Germany at 2330 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Weather misty and rainy. Morale of troops excellent. Received and evacuated 5 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Uningen, Germany WS 3613, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor from City of Welzheim, Germany to City of Uningen, Germany. Left old location at 1400, traveled 24 miles and arrived at Uningen, Germany at 1600. Station ready to receive and evacuate casualties at 1640. Morale of troops excellent. Received 13 casualties, evacuated 5 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta and 8 to 44th Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Schorndorf, Germany WS 3124, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. Closed station at Sulzbach, Germany 1130. Left area at 1300. Company moved by convoy and arrived at Schorndorf, Germany at 1555. Station in operation at 1615. Received 14 casualties and evacuated 13 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta. Roads poor.

Company "D": Murrhardt, Germany WS 3545, Ellwangen, Germany Sheet V-4, 1:100,000. 2nd Platoon left Bensheim, Germany 0400, traveled approximately 104 miles and set up station in Murrhardt, Germany. 1st Platoon closed station at Neuenstein, Germany at 1600. Received 47 casualties, evacuated 43, returned to duty 18, and remaining 37.

22 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Murrhardt, Germany WS 3545.

Company "A": Otlingen, Germany WS 2407, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Departed Michelau, Germany at 1400, traveled 23 miles to arrive at Otlingen, Germany at 1630. Weather cloudy. Roads dusty. Morale of troops excellent. Received 10 casualties and 1 civilian casualty. Evacuated 10 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta and 1 civilian casualty to civilian hospital at Otlingen, Germany.

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22 - April (Cont'd): Company "B": Weilheim, Germany WS 3203, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company departed from City of Utingen, Germany at 1000 and moved a distance of 6 miles by motor march to City of Weilheim, Germany, arriving at 1200. Received 16 casualties including 2 prisoners of war and 1 Dutch refugee. Evacuated 3 to 10th Armored Div Clr Sta, 9 to 44th Inf Div Clr Sta and 4 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Kirchheim, Germany WS 2606, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by convoy leaving Schorndorf, Germany at 1020 enroute to Kirchheim, Germany at 1230. Station in operation at 1250. One half station remained in operation at Schorndorf, Germany closing at 1515 then moved forward and joined company at 1830. Received and evacuated 47 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta. Roads fair.

Company "D": Murrhardt, Germany WS 3545. 1st Platoon closed station at Neuenstein, Germany at 0800. Left Neuenstein, Germany at 1000, traveled approximately 45 miles to Kirchheim, Germany and opened station at 1800. Received 43 casualties, evacuated 49, returned to duty 3, and remaining 28.

23 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Kirchheim, Germany WS 2606, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Left Murrhardt, Germany at 0800 and traveled 45 miles to arrive at Kirchheim, Germany WS 269062 at 1130.

Company "A": Otlingen, Germany WS 2407. Received 11 casualties including 2 prisoners of war and evacuated 11 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Schopfloch, Germany WX 3295, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company left City of Weilheim, Germany at 0900 and moved by motor to City of Gutenberg, Germany arriving at 1000. Distance traveled 8 miles. At 1900 company relocated from City of Gutenberg, Germany to City of Schopfloch, Germany arriving at new site at 1945. Distance 2 miles. Dispatched Litter Squads to Bn Aid Stations. Collecting Station in operation at 2000. Received 78 casualties including 10 prisoners of war, 2 German civilians and 1 Russian refugee and evacuated 78 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Eningen, Germany WX 1288, Reutlingen, Germany Sheet W-3, 1:100,000. Closed station at Kirchheim, Germany 0830. Left area at 0900. Company moved by convoy arriving at Metzingen, Germany at 1040. Station in operation at 1100. Closed station at Metzingen, Germany 1620, left area 1630. Company moved by convoy arriving at Eningen, Germany 1710. Received and evacuated 19 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta. One Litter Squad on duty at 2nd Bn Aid Station and evacuating directly to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Kirchheim, Germany WS 2606, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. 2nd Platoon closed station at Murrhardt, Germany 1100. Departed Murrhardt, Germany 1400, traveled approximately 45 miles to Kirchheim, Germany and joined 1st Platoon. Received 192 casualties, evacuated 149, returned to duty 27, and remaining 44.

24 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Kirchheim, Germany WS 2606.

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24 - April (Cont'd): Company "A": Geislingen, Germany WS 5503, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Departed Otlingen, Germany at 1300 and traveled 20 miles to arrive at Geislingen, Germany at 1430 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Received 4 casualties including 1 displaced personnel and evacuated 4 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Geislingen, Germany WS 5505, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor at 2055 from City of Schopfloch, Germany to City of Geislingen, Germany arriving at 2350. Distance traveled 35 miles. Collecting Station in operation at 2400. Received 27 casualties including 6 prisoners of war, 2 German civilians and 1 French soldier and evacuated 27 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Eningen, Germany WX 1288. Received 45 casualties and evacuated 44 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Kirchheim, Germany WS 2606. 2nd Platoon left Kirchheim, Germany at 1330, traveled 25 miles to Geislingen, Germany and opened station there at 1600. Received 122 casualties, evacuated 113, returned to duty 1, and remaining 23.

25 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Geislingen, Germany WS 5401, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Moved 24 miles from Kirchheim, Germany to Geislingen, Germany WS 543049. Left 0800 and arrived at new area at 1000.

Company "A": Gottingen, Germany WX 7388, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Departed Geislingen, Germany at 1845 and traveled 20 miles to arrive at Gottingen, Germany at 2100 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Received 23 casualties including 2 prisoners of war and evacuated 23 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Beimerstetten, Germany WX 6589, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor from City of Geislingen, Germany to City of Beimerstetten, Germany. Departed old location at 1400, traveled 12 miles and arrived at new site at 1840. Roads good. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Albeck, Germany WX 7189, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Closed Collecting Station at Eningen, Germany 0930 and left area at 1020. Departed Eningen, Germany and traveled by motor to Albeck, Germany arriving at 1755. Received and evacuated 21 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Geislingen, Germany WS 5404, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company Hqs Section left Kirchheim, Germany at 1330, traveled 25 miles to Geislingen, Germany. Received 51 casualties, evacuated 43, returned to duty 1, and remaining 30.

26 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Geislingen, Germany WS 5404.

Company "A": Kissendorf, Germany WX 8180, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Collecting Station #1 and half the company departed Gottingen, Germany at 1800 and traveled 10 miles to arrive at Kissendorf, Germany at 2130. Received and evacuated 14 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

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26 - April (Cont'd): Company "B": Weibenhorn, Germany WX 7970, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor at 1500 from City of Beimerstetten, Germany to City of Weibenhorn, Germany arriving at 2300. Distance traveled 36 miles. Collecting Station received 18 casualties including 1 prisoner of war, 1 German civilian and 1 Russian laborer and evacuated 18 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": En route to new location at Ettishofen, Germany. Collecting Station remained in operation at Albeck, Germany until 2130 and then closed station and departed for new area. Received 27 casualties and evacuated 26 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Geislingen, Germany WS 5404. Received 99 casualties, evacuated 87, returned to duty 11, and remaining 32.

27 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Bad Worishofen, Germany WY 1237, Weilheim, Germany Sheet X-5, 1:100,000. Left Geislingen, Germany at 1330, traveled 69 miles by motor to Bad Worishofen, Germany WY 128377 arriving at 2000. Formation of enemy planes began to strafe motorized column but stopped upon recognizing Red Cross markings on vehicles, however resumed strafing of combat vehicles ahead of our column. Roads good. Weather cloudy and rainy.

Company "A": Altenstadt, Germany WY 3418, Ulm, Germany Sheet W-4, 1:100,000. Collecting Station #1 departed Kissendorf, Germany at 0800 and traveled 15 miles to arrive at Neuburg, Germany at 1100 and set up in operation. Collecting Station #2 and remainder of company arrived at Neuburg, Germany at 1600. Collecting Station #1 departed Neuburg, Germany at 1630 and traveled 65 miles to arrive at Altenstadt, Germany at 2359. Received and evacuated 17 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Baisweil, Germany WY 0931, Weilheim, Germany Sheet X-5, 1:100,000. Company moved by motor at 0300 from City of Weibenhorn, Germany to City of Baisweil, Germany arriving at 2200. Distance 45 miles. Received and evacuated 6 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Landsberg, Germany WY 3344, Weilheim, Germany Sheet X-5, 1:100,000. Company arrived at Ettishofen, Germany 0145, enroute from site of old location in Albeck, Germany. Departed Ettishofen, Germany at 1100, traveled by convoy and arrived at Landsberg, Germany at 2140. Received and evacuated 1 casualty to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Bad Worishofen, Germany WY 1237, Weilheim, Germany Sheet X-5, 1:100,000. Clr Sta 1st Platoon left Kirchheim, Germany arriving at Geislingen, Germany at 0800. Left Geislingen, Germany at 1300, traveled 69 miles and set up station in Bad Worishofen, Germany at 2030. 2nd Platoon closed station at Geislingen, Germany at 1800. Received 26 casualties, evacuated 26, returned to duty 3, and remaining 29.

28 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Bad Worishofen, Germany WY 1237.

Company "A": Altenstadt, Germany WY 3418. Collecting Station #2 and remainder of company joined station #1 at 1300. Received 27 casualties including 6 prisoners of war and evacuated 26 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

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28 - April (Cont'd): Company "B": Stotten, Germany WY 2108, Fussen, Germany Sheet Y-5, 1:100,000. Company departed by motor at 0830 from City of Baisweil, Germany to City of Stotten, Germany arriving at 1215. Distance 25 miles. Station in operation at 1250. Received and evacuated 4 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Landsberg, Germany WY 3344. Received 29 casualties and evacuated 27 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Bad Worishofen, Germany WY 1237. 2nd Platoon arrived at Bad Worishofen, Germany at 1430 and joined 1st Platoon. Received 75 casualties, evacuated 70, returned to duty 8, and remaining 24.

29 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Ober-Ammergau, Germany WD 5094, Fussen, Germany Sheet Y-5, 1:100,000. Moved from Bad Worishofen, Germany a distance of 55 miles to Ober-Ammergau, Germany WD 501942. Left old area at 1330 and arrived at new area 2000. Weather cold and snow.

Company "A": Garmisch, Germany WD 5282, Inst Sheet Z-5, Germany 1:100,000. Departed Altenstadt, Germany at 1400 and traveled 40 miles to arrive at Garmisch, Germany at 2359 where Collecting Station #1 set up in operation. Received 4 casualties and 1 PW casualty. Departed at 1520 from old site and traveled by motor to new location arriving at 1650. Distance 11 miles. Roads good. Weather very cold. Morale of troops excellent. Collecting Station in operation at 1725. Received and evacuated 10 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Landsberg, Germany WY 3344. Forty-three (43) enlisted men and one (1) officer remained at Landsberg awaiting orders to move forward. Remainder of company moved by convoy with Combat Team at 2400 in vicinity of Rottenbuch, Germany enroute to new area. Received and evacuated 6 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Ober-Ammergau, Germany WD 5094, Fussen, Germany Sheet Y-5, 1:100,000. 2nd Platoon left Bad Worishofen, Germany 1330 and traveled 55 miles to new location in Ober-Ammergau, Germany. Ready for operation at 2200. Received 21 casualties, evacuated 23, returned to duty 12, and remaining 10.

30 - April: Hq & Hq Det: Ober-Ammergau, Germany WD 5094.

Company "A": Garmisch, Germany WD 5282. Received 25 casualties including 5 prisoners of war and evacuated 25 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Prem, Germany WY3001. Received and evacuated 10 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Garmisch, Germany WD 5282. Arrived at Farchant, Germany 0300. Left Farchant, Germany at 1335 and arrived at Garmisch, Germany at 1355. Received 4 casualties including 1 PW casualty which was evacuated to PW hospital, evacuated 3 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

19 - April: Cavanaugh, Thomas E., Jr. (MC) O-435435, Capt., departed temporary duty 411th Inf Reg't Med Det this Div. Duration unknown.



During the early part of the month the mission of the 103d Infantry Division continued to be that of occupation of Germany, consequently the mission of the Medical Battalion remained the same. The Division continued to occupy the area it was assigned in March until 8 April when it moved to a new area of occupation which was as follows:

Starting at northern tip of area Division occupied the town of Fulda, Germany; south, just east of Gemunden thence southwest past Karistadt and north of Rothenfels to Obernburg; south through Miltenberg to Mosbach turning northwest to Eberbach on the Neckar River to Heidelberg; south to Hockenheim thence north along Rhine River through Mannheim, Worms and to a point just south of Oppenheim; thence northeast just south of Gerau, Morfelden, Langen, and Hanau to starting point.

The Division occupied the above mentioned territory until 20 April when orders were received sending it back on the line.

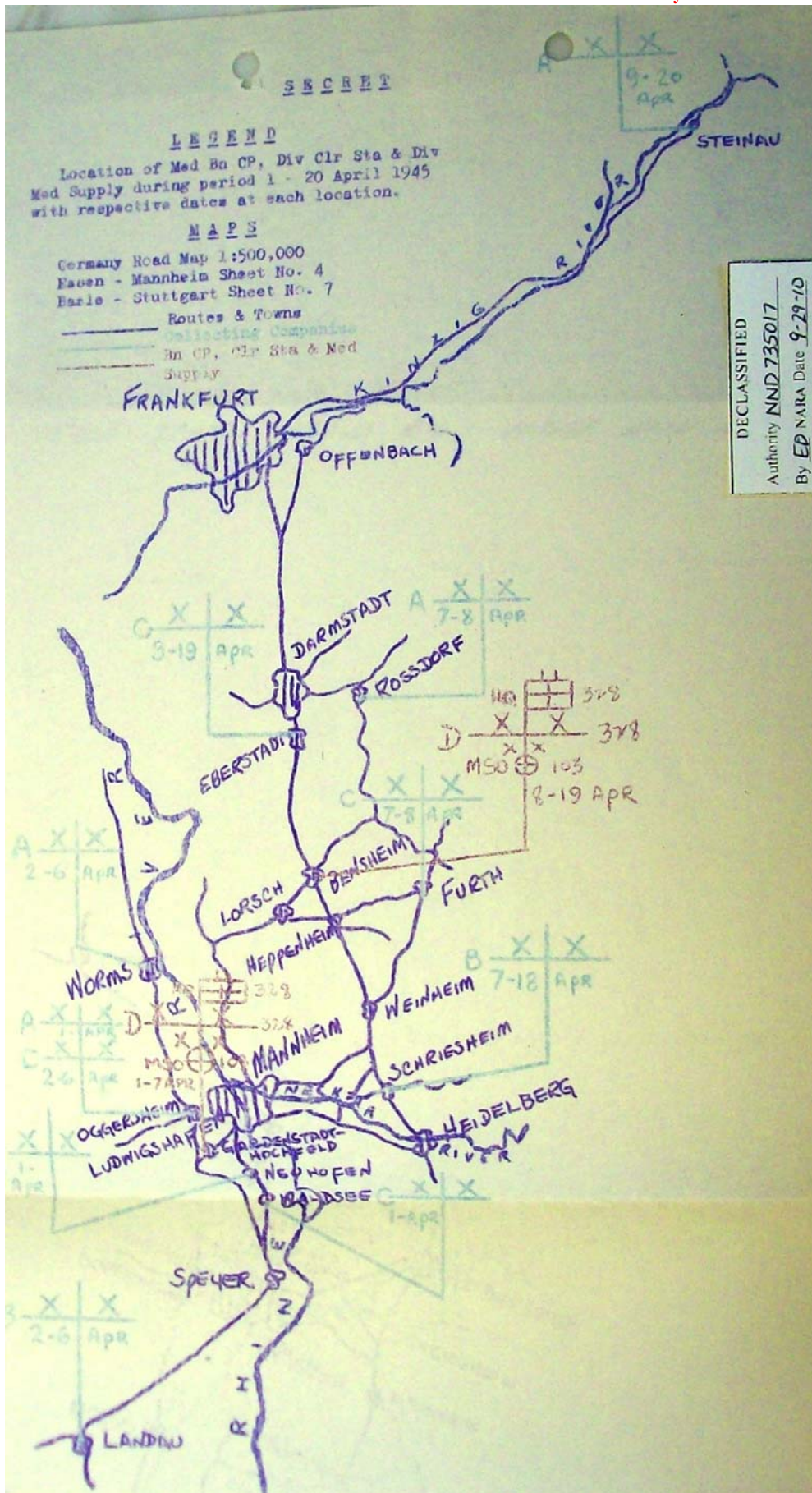

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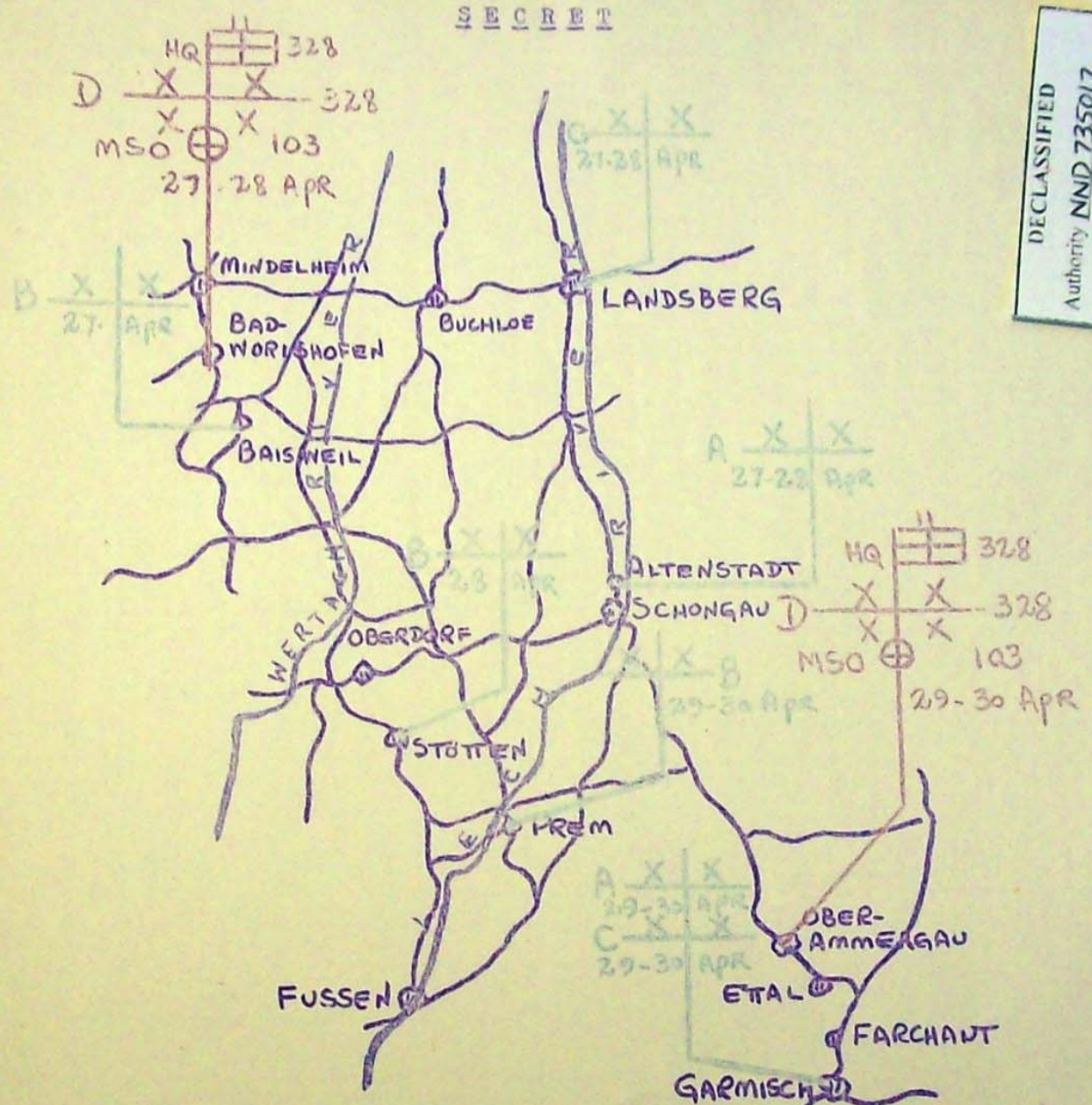
