1 - 9 January: Strength: 32 Officers, 2 Warrant Officers, 1 Chaplain (Atch'd), 395 Enlisted Men.

Hq. & Hq Det: Insming, France 1½ km S ZQ 3638 - Sarre Union Sheet 36/14
1:50,000 - Q367386.

Company "A": Hoste-Bas, France, ZQ 3852 - Sarreguemines Sheet 36/13,
1:50,000. During this period 75 casualties were received and 70 evacuated to the 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Putteltange, France ZQ 4150 - Sarreguemines Sheet 36/13.
1:50,000 - Q412500. During this period 88 casualties were received and evacuated to the 103d Infantry Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": City of Seingbouse, France ZQ 3457 - St Avoild Sheet 35/13,
1:50,000. During this period 209 casualties were received and 208 evacuated to the 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "D": Insming, France 1½ km S ZQ 3638 - Sarre Union Sheet 36/14
1:50,000 - Q367386. During this period Company "D", the 103d Division Clearing Station received 400 casualties, evacuated 287 and returned to duty 96.

10 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Morhange, France ZQ 2036. Bn CP & Hq Det moved from vicinity of Insming, France by motor march approximately 13 miles to Morhange, France, grid coordinates Q202366 Chateau Salins Sheet 35/14, 1:50,000 Nord de Guerre. Left old area at 0900 and arrived at new area at 1100 and immediately set up for operations.

Company "A": Hoste Bas, France ZQ 3852. Received 4 casualties and evacuated 3 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Putteltange, France ZQ 4150. Received and evacuated 6 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": City of Seingbouse, France, ZQ 3457. Received and evacuated 15 casualties to 103d Infantry Division Clearing Station.

Company "D": Morhange, France ZQ 2036. Second Platoon left area 1½ km S of Insming, France at 0800. Traveled approximately 13 miles by motor and set up station in Morhange, France at 1000. Received 27 casualties, evacuated 20, returned to duty, 12 and 93 remaining.

11 - 13 January: Hq & Hq Det: Morhange, France ZQ 2036.

Company "A": Hoste Bas, France ZQ 3852. Received 21 casualties and evacuated 17 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Putteltange, France ZQ 4150. Received and evacuated 27 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

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11 - 13 January (Cont'd): Company "C": City of Seingbouse, France ZQ 3457. Received and evacuated 69 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.
Company "D": Morhange, France ZQ 2036. First Platoon left area 1½ km S of Insming, France at 0800. Traveled approximately 13 miles by motor and set up and joined second platoon at Morhange, France at 1800. Received 130 casualties, evacuated 87, returned to duty 29 and remaining 107.

14 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Morhange, France ZQ 2036.
Company "A": Froeschwiller, France WQ 9938. Departed Hoste Bas, France at 1700 and traveled 91 miles by motor to arrive at Froeschwiller, France at 2300. weather clear and cold. Roads fair. Morale of troops: Excellent. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.
Company "B": City of Puttelange, France WQ 4150. Received and evacuated 6 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station including 3 French civilians.
Company "C": City of Seingbouse, France WQ 3457. Received 4 casualties and evacuated 3 to 103d Division Clearing Station.
Company "D": Morhange, France ZQ 2036. Received 24 casualties, evacuated 38, 10 returned to duty and 83 remaining.

15 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Morhange, France WQ 2036.
Company "A": Froeschwiller, France WQ 9938. Received 9 casualties and evacuated 6.
Company "B": City of Puttelange, France WQ 4150. Received and evacuated 11 casualties.
Company "C": City of Seingbouse, France WQ 3457. Received and evacuated 10 casualties.
Company "D": Morhange, France WQ 2036. Received 39 casualties, evacuated 82, 38 returned to duty and 2 remaining.

16 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Moved from Morhange, France Q202 Job, Chateau Salins Sheet 35/14 to Bouxwiller, France Q814250, Bouxwiller Sheet 37/14 Nord de Guerre. Distance traveled by motor approximately 58 miles. Departed Morhange, France at 1830 and arrived at Bouxwiller, France at 1400. Division rejoined VI Corps.
Company "A": Froeschwiller, France WQ 9938. Received 13 casualties and evacuated 6.
Company "B": Woerth, France 1½ mi S WR 8134. Company moved by motor march at 0425 from area Sarreguemines Q412506 to area Haguenau K 010346 arriving at 1810. Distance traveled approximately 94 miles. Set up CP and placed in operation. Dispatched litter squads to Bn Aid Stations. weather very cold. roads good. Morale of troops excellent.
Company "C": City of Seingbouse, France WQ 3457. Received 7 casualties and evacuated 6 to 650th Clearing Station.
Company "D": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Left area in Morhange, France at 0915. Traveled approximately 58 miles and set up station in Bouxwiller, France at 1500. Received 3 casualties, 5 remaining.

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17 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125.

Company "A": Froeschwiller, France WQ 9938. Received 10 casualties and evacuated 8 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Reichshoffen, France WQ 9536. Company relocated from area Haguenau R 010340 at 1500 to area Haguenau 0951365. Arrived at new site 1530. Distance traveled 5 miles by motor. Collecting Station set in operation 1040. Morale excellent. Weather cold and cloudy. Roads good.

Company "C": City of Oberbronn, France WQ 9038. Closed old area at Seingbouse, France at 1015. Arrived at Oberbronn, France 1015. New location is in a hospital having sufficient room for operation of station section and quartering of company. No casualties received. Weather windy and cold. Roads fair.

Company "D": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 20 casualties, evacuated 15 and 10 remaining.

18 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125.

Company "A": Froeschwiller, France WQ 9938. Received 12 casualties and evacuated 11 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Reichshoffen, France WQ 9536. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": Oberhoffen, France WR 0821. Closed old area at Oberbronn and departed division area with CT 411 on a special mission. Arrived at new location in vicinity of Kurtzenhausen, France at 1600. Ordered to move by Regimental CO at 2200. Left area in vicinity of Kurtzenhausen, France at 2225 and arrived at new location Oberhoffen, France at 0130. No casualties received.

Company "D": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 50 casualties, evacuated 26, returned to duty 3 and 31 remaining.

19 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125.

Company "A": Froeschwiller, France WQ 9938. Received 11 casualties and evacuated 9 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Reichshoffen, France WQ 9536. Received and evacuated 7 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": Oberhoffen, France WR 0821. Received 114 casualties and evacuated 95 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station. 18 men which were more seriously wounded were evacuated to the 891st Clearing Station. 1 casualty returned to duty. Weather and roads fair.

Company "D": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 141 casualties, evacuated 90, 3 returned to duty and 79 remaining.

20 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125.

Company "A": Bosselshausen, France WQ 8322. Departed Froeschwiller, France at 1800 and traveled 20 miles to Bosselshausen, France where Collecting Station set up in operation at 2045. Weather cloudy and snow. Morale excellent. Received 8 casualties and evacuated 7 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

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20 - January (Cont'd): Company "B": City of Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Company moved by blackout on motor march at 1945 from city of Reichshoffen, France to city of Bouxwiller, France. Arrived at 2300. Morale of troops excellent. Weather cold and snowing. Roads very icy. Collecting Station set up at 2350.

Company "C": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. One half Station Platoon and one half Headquarters Section moved to Ettendorf, France. One half of Station Platoon and Ambulance Platoon established at Brumath, France. Remainder of company moved to Bouxwiller, France. Received 26 casualties. Evacuated 10 to 891st Clearing Station and 16 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "D": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 56 casualties, evacuated 75, 3 returned to duty and 57 remaining.

21 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Sarrebourg, France WQ 5016. Moved from Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125 to Sarrebourg, France WQ 500160 Nord de Guerre. Distance traveled approximately 29 miles. Left Bouxwiller, France at 0900 and arrived at Sarrebourg, France at 1100. Roads icy and weather cold.

Company "A": Bosselshausen, France WQ 8322. Received 20 casualties and evacuated 19 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": City of Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received and evacuated 11 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. One half Station Platoon and one half Headquarters Section at Ettendorf, France also one half Station Platoon and Ambulance Platoon at Brumath, France moved and joined remainder of company at Bouxwiller, France. Received 15 casualties and evacuated 12 to 103d Division Clearing Station. Weather Snow and cold.

Company "D": Sarrebourg, France WQ 5016. Left area in Bouxwiller, France at 0715. Traveled approximately 30 miles by motor and set up station in Sarrebourg, France at 1200. Received 50 casualties, evacuated 43, 2 returned to duty and 62 remaining.

22 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Sarrebourg, France WQ 5016.

Company "A": Bosselshausen, France WQ 8322. Received 18 casualties and evacuated 15 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. No casualties received.

Company "C": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received and evacuated 14 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station. Weather cloudy and cold.

Company "D": Sarrebourg, France WQ 5016. Received 58 casualties, evacuated 37, 6 returned to duty and 77 remaining.

23 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Sarrebourg, France WQ 5016.

Company "A": Bosselshausen, France WQ 8322. Received and evacuated 13 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received and evacuated 20 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 15 casualties and evacuated 11 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

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23 - January (Cont'd): Company "D", Sarrebourg, France WQ 5016. Received ~~44~~ casualties, evacuated 35, 11 returned to duty and 75 remaining.

24 - January: Hq & Hq Det: Saverne, France WQ 7215. Left old area Sarrebourg, France at ~~0900~~ by motor and moved to Saverne, France Q725159 Nord de Guerre. Distance traveled approximately 12 miles. Arrived at new area 1045. Company "A": Bosselshausen, France WQ 8322. Received and evacuated 14 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "B": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received and evacuated 45 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "C": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 18 casualties and evacuated 16 to 103d Division Clearing Station.

Company "D": Saverne, France WQ 7215. Left area in Sarrebourg, France at ~~0900~~. Traveled approximately 12 miles by motor and set up station in Saverne, France at 1015. Received 77 casualties, evacuated 60, 6 returned to duty, 1 died and 85 remaining.

25 - 31 January: Hq & Hq Det: Saverne, France WQ 7215.

Company "A": Bosselshausen, France WQ 8322. Received 60 casualties and evacuated 55 to 103d Division Clearing Station during this period.

Company "B": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received and evacuated 255 casualties to 103d Division Clearing Station during this period. Largest casualties were received on 25 January: 102 received and evacuated.

Company "C": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 136 casualties and evacuated 132 to 103d Division Clearing Station during this period.

Company "D": Saverne, France WQ 7215. Received 477 casualties, evacuated 360 and 121 returned to duty during this period. On 31 Jan there were 80 patients remaining in the Clearing Station.

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Operations in France, January 1945 (Cont'd)

Lt. Col. Melvin F. Huth, MC., Battalion Commander on duty as Acting Division Surgeon from 1-3 January 1945 and from 6-13 January 1945 during the temporary absence of Lt. Col. James W. Easton, MC., Division Surgeon.

During the early part of the month the Division was still in a holding action. The Germans began attacking units on our flanks, the 106th Cavalry Reconnaissance Group on our left and the 44th Infantry Division on our right, shortly after 312400 December 1944 and it was shortly after this that the following message was received from our division G-2 to the Battalion S-2:

"PW CAPTURED BY FLEET SAID
THE ATTACK WOULD CONTINUE
THIS MORNING WITH FOUR PAN-
ZER DIVISIONS. NO INFORMATION
ON PLACE OR TIME. ALERT
YOUR UNIT".

The above message was received at 010555 Jan 1945. Similar messages were immediately delivered to units of our battalion. However during the days that followed the German attack was repelled and our units remained in their positions.

On 6 January 1945 the Division Commander, Major General Charles C. Haffner, Jr., was relieved of his command because of ill health. His successor is Brigadier General Anthony C. McAuliffe, formerly commander of the 101st Airborne Division. Brigadier General McAuliffe assumed command of the 103d Infantry Division on 11 January 1945.

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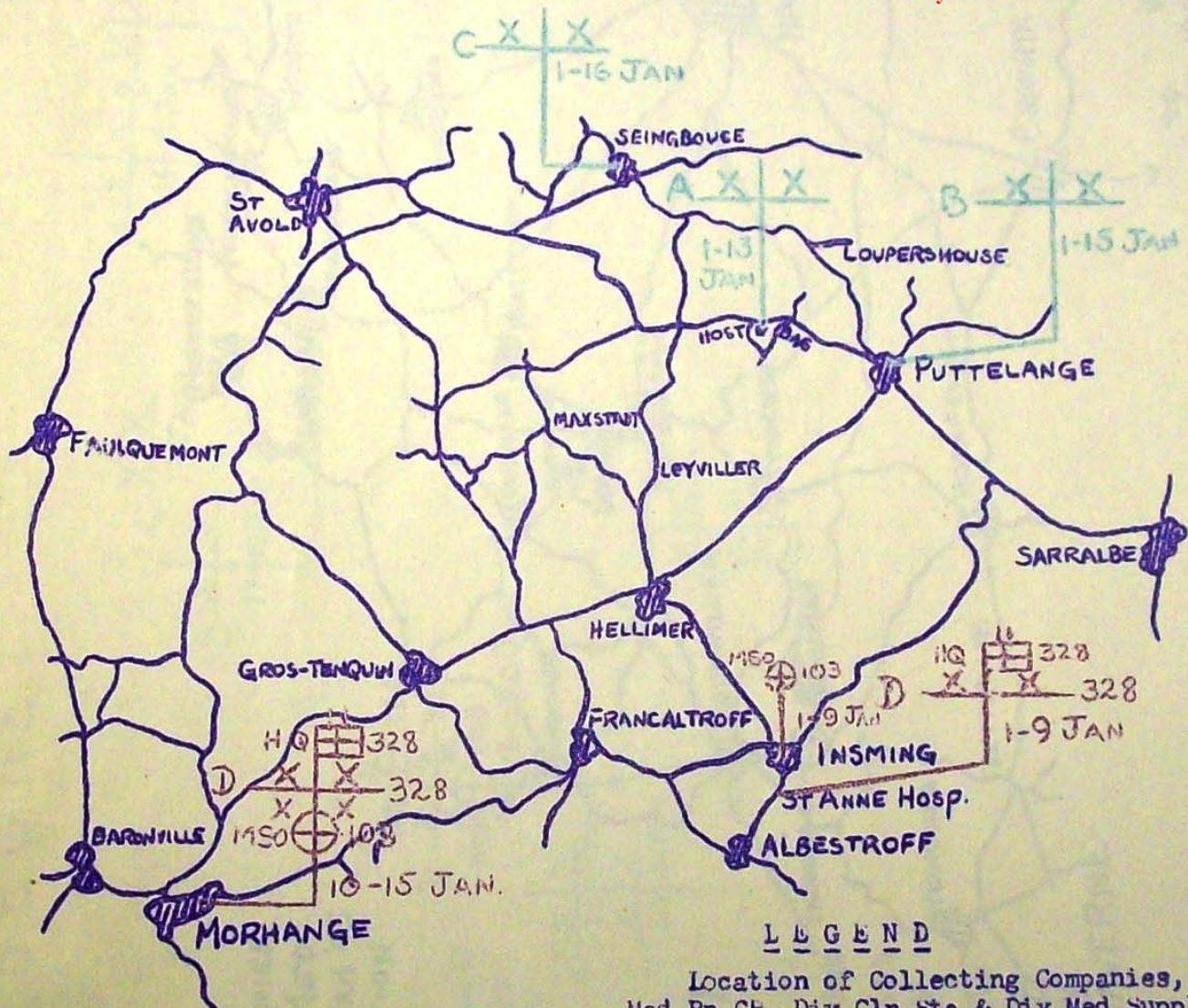
