Started operations at 1100. Received 282 casualties, evacuated 324, returned to duty 3, and remaining 15.

16 - March: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Motor Pool and Div Med Supply moved from Saverne, France to Bouxwiller, France.

Company "A": Zutzendorf, France WQ 8628. Remaining half of Station Platoon and Litter Bearer Platoon left Bouxwiller, France at 1000 traveled 4 miles and arrived at Zutzendorf, France at 1030. Received and evacuated 6 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Zutzendorf, France WQ 8628. Received and evacuated 67 casualties including 4 prisoners of war to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Muhlhause, France WQ 8632, Bouxwiller Sheet 37/14, 1:50,000 Advance Collecting Station, Headquarters Section and Ambulance Platoon established at Muhlhause, France at 1430. Remainder of Company remained in Bouxwiller, France awaiting orders to move forward. Litter squads were called for by all Battalion Aid Stations. Received and evacuated 75 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125. Received 226 casualties, evacuated 215, returned to duty 12, and remaining 14.

17 - March: Hq & Hq Det: Bouxwiller, France WQ 8125.

Company "A": Gundershoffen, France WQ 9434, Haguenau Sheet 38/14, 1:50,000 NDG. Departed Zutzendorf, France at 0800 and arrived at Uhrwiller, France at 0815. Departed Uhrwiller, France at 0950 and arrived at Engwiller, France at 1010 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Departed Engwiller, France at 1700 and arrived at Gundershoffen, France at 1800 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Distance traveled 7½ miles. Received 20 casualties and evacuated 19 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Gumbrechtshoffen, France WQ 9233, Haguenau Sheet 38/14, 1:50,000 NDG. Company Headquarters, Station and Ambulance Platoons moved by motor at 1300 from City of Zutzendorf, France to City of Gumbrechtshoffen, France and arrived at new site at 1350. Distance traveled 5 miles. Received and evacuated 64 casualties including 2 prisoners of war to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Departed Gundershoffen, France at 0830 and traveled 5 miles to arrive at Woerth, France at 0915 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Departed Woerth, France at 1930 and traveled 6 miles to arrive at road junction  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles S of Climbach, France at 2045 where collecting station set up. Weather clear. Roads dusty. Morale of troops excellent. Received 27 casualties and evacuated 25 to 103d Inf Div Ctr Sta.

Company "B": Reichshoffen, France WQ 9536, Haguenau Sheet 38/14, 1:50,000 NDG. Company Headquarters and Ambulance Platoon moved by motor at 0800 from City of Gumbrechtshoffen, France to City of Reichshoffen, France. Arrived at new site at 0850. Distance traveled 5 miles. Litter Platoon moved at 1100 from Zutendorf, France to Reichshoffen, France by motor and arrived at 1200. Collecting Station set up in operation and received and evacuated 12 casualties to 103d Inf Div Ctr Sta.

Company "C": Wingen, France WR 0547, Lembach Sheet 38/13, 1:50,000 NDG. Half Station Platoon, Ambulance Platoon and Headquarters moved to Villa Mellon, France Q946406. Remainder of Company at Bouxwiller, France joined advance party at 1200. Half Station Platoon, Ambulance Platoon and Headquarters moved to Langensultzbach, France Q998410 at 1300. Half Station Platoon, Ambulance Platoon and Headquarters moved to Wingen, France and set up for operations at 2100. Litter Platoon and kitchen personnel remained at Villa Mellon, France and half station platoon remained at Langensultzbach, France awaiting orders to move forward. Roads poor. Received and evacuated 61 casualties to 103d Inf Div Ctr Sta.

Company "D": Niederbronn, France WQ 9238, Haguenau Sheet 38/14, 1:50,000 NDG. 2nd Platoon left area in Saverne, France at 0800, traveled approximately 20 miles and set up in Niederbronn, France at 1200. 1st Platoon left area in Bouxwiller, France at 1200, traveled approximately 10 miles and joined 2nd Platoon in Niederbronn, France. Received 89 casualties and evacuated 89.

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19 - March: Hq & Hq Det: Drachenbronn, France WR 0942, Lembach Sheet 38/13, 1:50,000 NDG. Bn CP and Div Med Supply moved from City of Niederbronn, France WQ 925388 at 1000 and traveled approximately 15 miles by motor march to Drachenbronn, France WQ 091427. Arrived at new site approximately 1130 and started operations. Weather good. Roads fair.

Company "A": Area  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles SE of Bobenthal, Germany WR 1149, Lembach Sheet 38/13, 1:50,000 NDG. Collecting Station No. 1 departed road junction  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles S of Climbach, France and traveled from 1700 to 1800 to arrive at area  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles SE of Bobenthal, Germany. Distance traveled 6 miles. Collecting Station No. 2 remained in area  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles S of Climbach, France. Weather clear. Roads dusty. Received 70 casualties including 1 prisoner of war and evacuated 69 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Lembach, France  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S WR 0343, Lembach Sheet 38/13, 1:50,000 NDG. Company Headquarters and Litter Platoon relocated from city of Reichshoffen, France to vicinity of City of Lembach, France. Departed old site at 1000 and arrived at new location at 1100. Distance traveled 6 miles. Station and Ambulance Platoon moved from City of Reichshoffen, France to City of Climbach, France leaving old site at 0900 and arriving at new site at 0940. Distance traveled 6 miles. Roads and weather good. Morale of troops superior. Collecting Station open and ready to receive and evacuate casualties at 1000. Received and evacuated 21 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Wingen, France WR 0547. Ambulance Platoon moved from Wingen, France to Bobenthal, Germany 1715. Half Station Platoon moved from Langensultzbach, France to Wingen, France. Litter Platoon remained at Villa Mellon France awaiting orders to move forward. Kitchen personnel moved from Villa Mellon, France to Wingen, France. One litter squad on duty with 1st Bn Aid Station. Roads rough and poor. Received 114 casualties and evacuated 113 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "D": Drachenbronn, France WR 0942, Lembach Sheet 38/13, 1:50,000 NDG. 1st Platoon left area in Niederbronn, France 1000 traveled approximately 15 miles and set up station in Drachenbronn, France at 1300. 2nd Platoon left Niederbronn, France 1600, closing station, and traveled 15 miles and joined 1st Platoon in Drachenbronn, France. Received 204 casualties and evacuated 142. Patients remaining 62.

20 - March: Hq & Hq Det: Drachenbronn, France WQ 0942.

Company "A": St. Germanshof, Germany WR 1149, Lembach Sheet 38/13, 1:50,000 NDG. Departed area  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles SE of Bobenthal, Germany at 1500, traveled 1 mile to arrive at St. Germanshof, Germany at 1515 where Collecting Station set up in operation. Received 107 casualties including 6 prisoners of war and evacuated 106 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "B": Lembach, France  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S WR 0343. Collecting Station remained in operation and received and evacuated 14 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Wingen, France WR 0547. Litter platoon joined Company at Wingen, France. Station Platoon and Headquarters Section remained in operation at Wingen, France. Ambulance Platoon remained in Bobenthal, Germany. 5 Litter squads on duty with Bn Aid Stations. Received 65 casualties and evacuated 64 to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Morale of troops excellent. Received and evacuated 10 casualties including 1 prisoner of war to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Company "C": Wingen, France WR 0547. Station Platoon and Headquarters Section remained in Wingen, France. Ambulance Platoon remained in Bobenthal, Germany. All litter squads returned to Company. Received and evacuated 35 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

Received 129 casualties including 62 prisoners of war and evacuated 128 casualties to 103d Inf Div Clr Sta.

On 15 March 1945, Company "D", the Division Clearing Station, received the largest number of casualties for one day since 9 November 1944 when the Division moved to combat zone. A total of 282 casualties were received on 15 March 1945.

Hotel Kurs, located in the City of Niederbronn, France, in which the installations of the Med Bn CP, Div Clr Sta., and Div Med Supply were set up in on 18 March 1945 and morning of 19 March 1945, blew up on 19 March at approximately 1330, not more than five hours after these installations had moved to Drachenbronn, France. Engineers, after examining the ruins, stated that the hotel had been blown up by a time bomb containing around 600 pounds of TNT. The section of the building in which the CP and Div Med Supply had been previously set up in was in complete ruins. The time bomb is believed to have been planted somewhere on the second floor.

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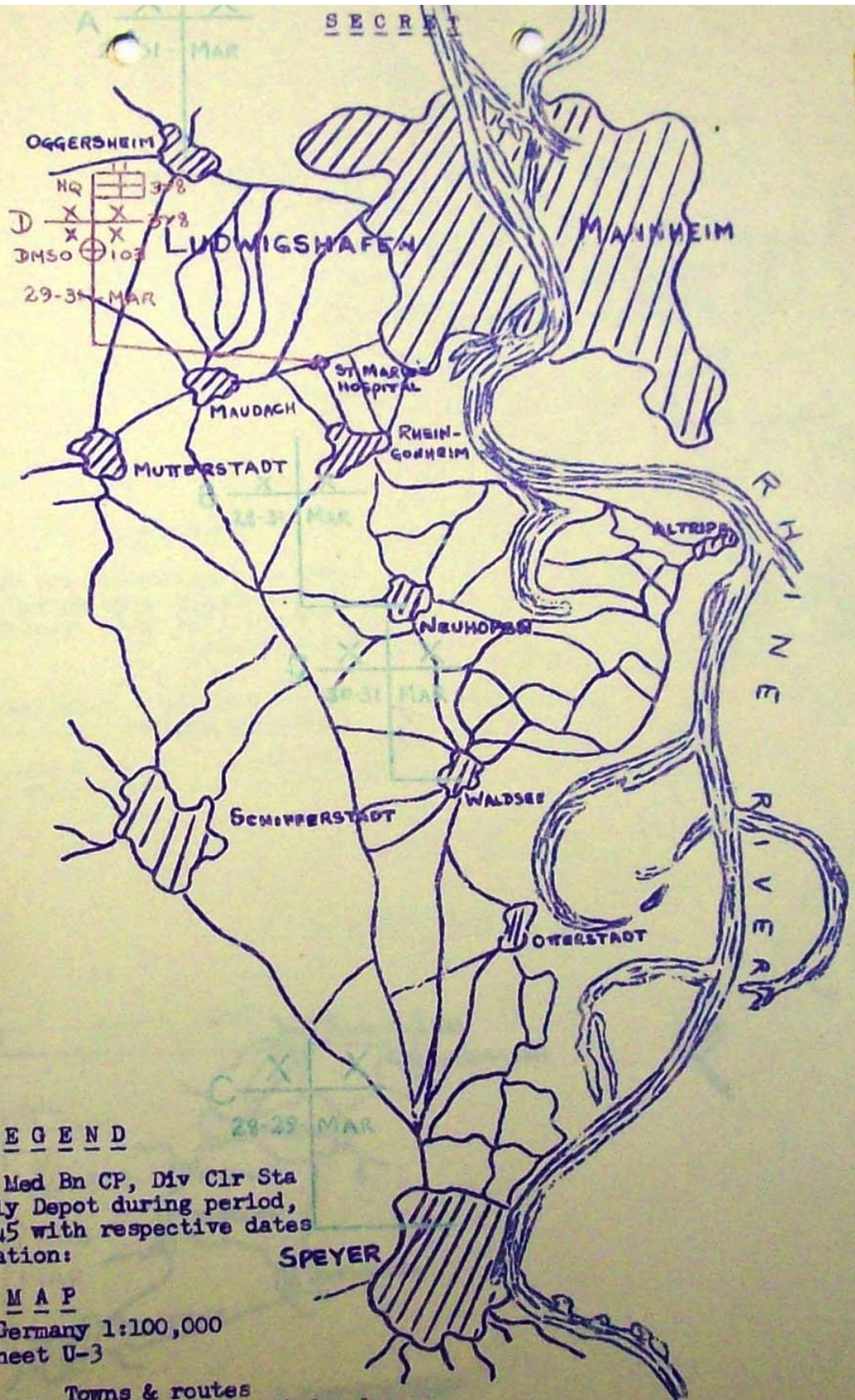
