SUBJECT: Critique Of Unit.

TO : Commanding General, 103d Infantry Division.

During November, 1944 many new problems and experiences confronted this unit. The problems and obstacles were met and overcome with more than ordinary success. It was the first period of actual combat service. This unit has had a good training record. In view of this, it was expected that combat record would likewise be good. The performance of all personnel, however, was beyond and better than the expectations.

Many lessons were learned and learned well. It was necessary to change certain lessons previously taught, such as the danger of large doses of morphine. In general, however, battle procedures closely followed training procedures.

Professional care of injured patients through our part of the chain of evacuation received commendation from rear echelon units on several specific occasions. This was with reference to care by both enlisted and officer personnel.

Evacuation by the three collecting companies was very efficient and no doubt resulted in the saving of life as well as relieving the burden of more forward units.

Enlisted personnel, company officers, company commanders and staff gave every indication that they were diligent, cooperative and able. Special mention should be made of the outstanding aggressive action of the three collecting company commanders and the Battalion supply officer and section.

As a unit and as individuals we still have much to learn, but it is anticipated that the above good record will be further improved in the service we will render in that part of the job which is yet to be done.

Company "C": Collecting Station remained in operation at la Bolle, France., St Die V373643. Set up Advance Collecting Station in vicinity of les Cours, France. Received and evacuated twenty-five (25) casualties.
