

PRIZED POSSESSIONS

A daylight raid made by the 2nd Bn., 409th Inf. through a sleepy little German town disproved the report that the Mehrmscht had an arsenal stored there and a group of Nazi soldiers in hiding. But it showed T/Sgt. Claude Dugan, anti-tank platoon sergeant from St. Louis, Missouri, what three determined Germans prized most in life. Ordered to level his 57 mm. AT gun at the home of these civilians, who were suspected of concealing "gewehr", 5gt. Bugan stood by awaiting either a confession or a fire order.

Taking his cue, the third civilian, an old boy in knickers, dashed madly into the house. He double-timed out, his arms flailing in all directions, with a meerschaum pipe in his hands.
