NARRATIVE
409th INFANTRY REGIMENT
For Month of April 1945

The Regiment devoted the greater part of what was to prove the climactic month of the war in Europe, a month in which it was destined to reach the German-Austrian border, to the policing and patrolling of designated areas, the evacuation of displaced personnel and the support of the Military Government in its sector.

The 1st of April found the 409th still in Oggersheim (4699), Germany, preparing to move to the vicinity of Worms (4514) on the next day pursuant to March Order No. 11, this headquarters, dated 1 April 1945. The move was consummated without incident and the occupation of the area continued until the 6th when, in compliance with Operations Instruction No. 78, Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, March Order No. 12, detailing plans for movement across the Rhine River commencing at noon the next day to garrison, police and support the Military Government in the vicinity of Rossdorf (M7340), Germany, was issued by our headquarters. Reconnaissance of the new area was initiated by the Regiment and its attached units and quartering parties were sent out.

The Regiment closed in its new area at 2250, 7 April 1945, established liaison with Military Government authorities and made plans for future coordination and support. The battalions closed respectively at 2050, 2100 and 2230.

The Regiment occupied its assigned sector the next day and, in accordance with Operations Instructions No. 79, Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, which extended the area of our responsibility to the northeast and provided for our relief of elements of the 44th Infantry Division on security targets, staff and battalion commanders conducted reconnaissance of the proposed extension of our sector and made plans for movement on the following day. The 2d Battalion began its movement at 1500 and closed at 1800.

The remainder of the Regiment moved to the vicinity of Steinau (N2292) on the 9th, accomplished the relief of elements of the 44th Division on security targets and prepared to garrison, police and support the Military Government in its area. Company A, 328th Engineers (C) Battalion, was relieved from attachment to the Regiment per Operations Instruction No. 80, Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, dated 090900 April 1945. With minor variations in assigned duties and special tasks, which will be cited chronologically, the Combat Team continued its mission of policing, gathering up prisoners who still sought refuge in the hills and reallocating displaced personnel until the 18th when preparations were begun to return to combat.

On the 11th a Displaced Persons Team was assigned to the Combat Team and a Displaced Persons Collecting Point was set up in Gelnhausen (N0878).

On the 14th the 1st Battalion relieved elements of the Seventh Army Security Command guards at installations in the vicinity of Aschaffenberg (N012540). Relief was completed at 1130. Field Order No. 14, which incorporated instructions contained in Directive, RCT 409, from Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, 13 April 1945, and relating to the assumption of command of the sector, protecting installations, insuring security, collecting displaced persons and guarding DP centers, disarming and police of civilian population, support of the Military Government and relief of the Seventh Army Security Command guards, was issued. The disposition of the 1st and 3d Battalions was changed to

On the 15th the evacuation of displaced persons continued, the entire Bad Orb (N1582) DP Center being cleaned out.

Elements of the Combat Team were relieved by elements of the 276th Infantry Regiment of the 70th Division in the area west of Aschaffenburg (NO155) on the 18th and plans were made to complete the relief of the remainder of the Regiment on the following day.

On the 19th Headquarters Company and Companies A and B were relieved from guard posts by elements of the 70th Infantry Division while other elements awaited relief. March Order No. 15 was issued pursuant to Operations Instruction No. 81, Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, which ordered the 409th Regimental Combat Team with present attachments, upon relief from its present security mission, to assemble its battalions and make preparations for movement to an area in the vicinity south of Ouringen (S2868) to be designated. Battery D, 534th AAA Battalion, was to be released from attachment effective upon arrival in the new area.

Units of the Regimental Combat Team started their move to the new area on the 20th. The 382d Field Artillery Battalion closed at 1645, Cannon Company at 1800, Antitank Company at 1930 and the new Regimental CP opened at 1900 at (S340468). The Combat Team ceased in accordance with message order of the Commanding General, 103d Infantry Division, at 2000, the 382d Field Artillery Battalion reverting to Division Artillery control. The 3d Battalion was alerted for a special mission for VI Corps. It moved to its new area before daylight to await orders.

On the 21st the Regiment continued to comply with Operations Instruction No. 82, Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, which listed the Division mission as the seizure of its objective in the vicinity of Kirchheim (S2606) after passing through elements of the 44th and 100th Infantry Divisions and attacking in its zone; the 409th, with Company A, 328th Engineers (C) Battalion, and Company B, 614th Tank Destroyer Battalion, attached, was to follow the advance of Regimental Combat Team 411 prepared to repulse counterattacks from the west and likewise prepared to pass through either the 410th or 411 Infantry Regiments on Division order. The 2d Battalion closed in Haubersbronn (S3526) at 1915 and the Regiment followed in the zone of the 411th in compliance with the above Operations Instruction.

On the 22d the 409th followed the advances of the 411th Infantry and moved to new assembly areas. The 2d and 3d Battalions, the latter

remaining alerted for its special VI Corps mission that was never to materialize, closed in Kirchheim. The 1st Bn (-) moved to Schorndorf (S3124).

Early on the 23d the 2d Battalion was attached to Combat Team 410 by verbal order. The alert of the 3d Battalion for its projected mission under VI Corps auspices was cancelled and the unit marched to Kirchheim. Elements in the Seventh Army rear area were released from their security mission at 1200. Cannon Company, after spirited negotiations and the threat of employing the full power of its weapons against them, captured 300 prisoners in the woods in the vicinity of (S236106).

109th On the 24th the 1st and 3d Battalions closed in a new area in the vicinity of Geislingen (S5506) and relieved elements of the 44th Infantry Division. The 3d Battalion was assigned the mission of reconnaissance southeast to the line Nerenstetten (X7494)-Albeck (X7190)-Boilingen (X6885) and by the end of the day had reached (X6095) against meager opposition. The 1st Battalion, also meeting only light resistance, cleaned the towns of Stubersheim (S6001), Hoffstett-Emerbuch (S5502) and Ettien-schiess (X6198). The 2d Battalion, which had been attached to the 410th, reverted to Regimental control and was enroute to a new area as the day ended.

The Regiment continued to advance on the 25th, reaching the Danube

at 1700 with the 1st and 3d Battalions abreast. Reconnaissance of the river line was made and a likely site for an assault crossing was selected.

At 0255 on the morning of the 26th elements of the 3d Battalion crossed the Danube at (X742849) and established a bridgehead. At daylight the remainder of the battalion crossed and extended the bridgehead, remaining in position to protect the bridge being constructed at that point. In the afternoon the battalion moved over into its zone and at the close of the day had reached Rieden Ad Kotz (X8679), meeting only light resistance. The 1st and 2d Battalions crossed the Danube in the afternoon, the former passing through the 3d Battalion and reaching (X885785). The 2d Battalion remained in Reserve and at the end of the day was assembled in the vicinity of (X7784).

On the 27th the Regiment continued the attack from positions at (X885785) reached the previous day with the 1st Battalion leading and the 3d and 2d Battalion following. Burg (Y0465) was cleared at 0630 and the column continued south. An enemy column of horse-drawn vehicles was annihilated between Burg and Balzhausen (Y0464) by 0830 and the battalions advanced to the southeast. Another column of horse-drawn vehicles was caught near Zaisertshofen (Y0751). Numerous prisoners were captured and many horse-drawn vehicles were destroyed as the Regiment advanced over 70 kilometers to the vicinity of Schongau (Y5617). Company C, reinforced, crossed the Lech River on a hastily constructed footbridge to secure a site for a larger bridge.

On the 28th the Regiment assembled in Schongau and made preparations to cross the river upon completion of a Bailey or ponton bridge. The 2d Battalion moved over the river and relieved Company C as bridgehead security.

The next day ^{29th} the Regiment ^{Time?} crossed the Lech after the 10th Armored Division on a Bailey and ponton bridge and advanced to the southeast. The 3d Battalion, motorized, followed behind Task Force Hankins of Combat Command A, 10th Armored Division, supporting the Task Force in the destruction of any enemy forces which might delay the advance; the Regiment was further to protect the Division left (East) flank until relieved by elements of the 115th Cavalry Group. This was in conformity with Operations Instruction No. 90, Headquarters 105d Infantry Division. The 1st and 2d Battalions, behind the remainder of the 10th Armored Division, met little resistance and continued to follow the leading elements. At the end of the day the 3d Battalion at Mittenwald (D6577), the last town before the Austrian border, was preparing to pass through the 10th Armored Division which was halting because of darkness. Attached to the Regimental Combat Team for this drive were the following units: Company A, 328th Engineer (C) Battalion; 105d Cavalry Reconnaissance Troop (reinforced with the 1st and 2d Reconnaissance Platoons of the 614th Tank Destroyer Battalion); Company A, 781st Tank Battalion; Company A, 824th Tank Destroyer Battalion (SP); Company B, 614th Tank Destroyer Battalion (Towed); and Company B, 85d Chemical Mortar Bat-

talion.

The last day of the month found the Regimental Combat Team continuing to follow the advance of Combat Command of the 10th Armored Division. At 1755 orders were received from the Commanding General, 103d Infantry Division, to pass through Combat Command and continue the attack to the initial Corps objective which included In 31. 6 (D7657) and a large area to the west. Elements of the 3d Battalion overcame the opposition at a roadblock (D600823) by 1830. Other elements advanced to the vicinity of (D641020) as the month ended, progress being slowed by a blown bridge.
