409th INFAMIRY REGIMENT For Month of February 1945

Except for sporadic raids on enemy-held towns and routine patrol actions, February saw the Regiment continuing in the passive role in which it had been cast during the preceding month. Derensive positions were continually improved. Training was conducted for the constantly rotated reserve battalion. Orientation was provided on the flame thrower; men were familiarized with the appearance of the new M4AS tank; special courses of instruction for officers and men were conducted; weapons were zeroed in.

For the last quarter of the month the Regiment was held in Division Reserve and a daily 8-hour training schedule was maintained. During this period recreation was provided under the direction of Tec 5 Byron A. Gosden, 57447049, of Waterloo, Iowa, Regimental Entertainment Director, in the form of two taprooms in Bouxwiller (8125) that were converted for use of the men, and motion pictures that were exhibited in the town theatre. The two bistros, in a display of sentimental nostalgia, were christened Abe & Pappy's, after a Dallas cafe the men used to frequent, and Leon & Eddie's, after a New York night club they would have liked to have been in a position to frequent. They were open daily from 1000 to 2100, offering beer, magazines and writing paper and, after 1400, providing entertainment recruited from the ranks in the form of a band, accordion and piano solos, novelty acts and vocals. The Regimental Band, whose comple-

ment had been depleted in combat, performed very creditably although Impresario Gosden constantly lamented their lack of a trombonist and exhorted the Regimental Sergeant Major to carefully screen the Form 20s of reinforcements and divert one to his use.

The motion picture theatre, competently staffed by members of the 54th Special Service Company and equipped with their projection facilities, provided six showings a day beginning at 0500, 1000, 1500, 1500, 1800 and 2050. Recorded music was played between performances. Some of the films shown during this period were "Song of Bernadette", "Home in Indiana", and The Doughgirls".

Our own soldier show, "Laff It Off", was featured in the two cares until the 25d of February and was well received. Following that the 34th . Special Service Company staged "Stars without Garters" on the night of the 25th and the next two days. The Division Band was occasionally also pressed into service.

The 1st and 3d Battalions, Antitank, Headquarters and Cannon Companies of the Regiment and attached units of the 328th Medics, 328th Engineers, 48th Tank Battalion and 14th Armored Division, which were stationed in Eouxwiller, availed themselves of the entertainment facilities offered. The 2d Battalion in Obersoultzbach (7928) was alternately shuttled to Bouxwiller and provided with movies through the instrumentality of our own generator and projector, on those rare occasions when the latter was out of repair. Entrepreneur Cosden ventured to offer statistics to support his contention that our projector has been in repair longer and more often than any other

projector in any Army in any world. Service Company in Gottesheim (811195) was similarly cared for.

A day-by-day diary of events for the month follows:

#### 1 February

The 2d Battalion completed relief of elements of the 3d Battalion, 410th Infantry, at 2200. The 5d Battalion remained in Regimental Reserve in the vicinity of Obermodern (855275). Antitank Company made reconnaissance for new positions. Cannon Company CP moved to Ringeldorf (905251).

#### 2 February

Company C completed relief of Company B at 1815. Coordination was effected with the 506th Parachute Infantry on the right. A security school was conducted for elements of forward units. The 3d Battalion recommoitred and continued plans for a raid on Kindwiller (9029) to be conducted at some future date.

#### 3 February

The 1st and 2d Battalions occupied positions on the MLR and continued to improve foxholes and gun positions. Duck boards were constructed for foxholes. The 3d Battalion, in Regimental Reserve, was inspected by General McAulliffe. Company I continued preparations for its raid.

#### 4 February

In accordance with Operations Instruction No. 60, Hq 103d Division, dtd 041700 Feb 45, the Regiment relieved elements of the 506th Parachute Infantry, beginning at 2200. A raid on Kindwiller was unsuccessful as the enemy was on the alert and the force was unable to enter the town. Relief of the 506th had not been completed at the close of the period.

#### 5 February

The 1st Battalion extended the MLR in accordance with Operations Instructions No. 60. At 0053 the 3d Battalion completed relief of elements of the 506th Parachute Infantry of the 101st Airborne Division and coordinated our delense on the right boundary with the 502d Parachute Infantry.

#### 5 February (Cont'd)

Relief of Companies F and G in accordance with Operations Instruction No. 60 was accomplished by 1930 and the 2d Battalion moved to Bueswiller (8724) as Regimental Reserve.

#### 6 February

The 2d Battalion in Regimental Reserve made plans for counterattack and RRL. The 1st and 5d Battalions sent out two patrols each. The 3d improved positions and duckboarded foxholes.

#### 7 February

The 2d Battalion in reserve made plans for future raids. Patrols were active during the period. A small enemy patrol was ambushed and dispersed by fire, 1 German being killed. Two SP 90-mm TD guns fired on targets in Kindwiller and Bitschhoffen (9128), obtaining excellent results.

#### 8 February

At 0050, prior to the raid on Kindwiller, Capt Roger H. Craddock, 01296527, of Kinnsboro, Texas, Commanding Officer of Company C, checked in at the 1st Battalion outpost with his Battalion S-2 and was given information obtained from four prisoners captured about an hour earlier. The Company passed through the outpost at 0100 following a route along the north bank of the Moder River to the West that had been reconnoitred from the air the day before by Capt Craddock. For communications the CO was provided with an SCR 300 which maintained contact with la Walck; platoon leaders had SCR 536 radios which, however, proved useless.

At 0125 the party had proceeded about a thousand yards on its way. At 0140 Capt Craddock reported that he was changing direction to the north to approach Kindwiller on a previously planned line of march. Due to the dense vineyards they were traveling very slowly by 0210, having had no contact with the enemy. At 0225, when the Company was about 500 yards south of Kindwiller, one round of artillery from concentration No. 1 was called for to mark the west end of the town and sixteen minutes later one round of concentration No. 2 to mark the east end of town. At this time the Company was about 150 yards south of its objective and platoons were moving into position for the attack. At 0310, when about 50 yards from Kindwiller, enemy machine guns opened up. The two assault platoons, which were armed almost exclusively with N-3 sub-machine guns and BARs, returned the fire immediately. Capt Craddock called for artillery concentrations Nos. 1 and 2 to be

fired and also requested that artificial moonlight be turned on the town.

Three platoons entered the town, one assault platoon probing the streets to the east and the other clearing the buildings on the north side. The 3d platoon followed immediately to contend with the buildings on the south side. The 4th platoon remained in support about 75 yards south of town to be prepared to gather prisoners. By 0321 seven prisoners had been taken and placed in the custody of the support platoon. At 0321 Capt Craddock ordered the artificial moonlight to be extinguished and a minute later a green parachute flare, the prearranged signal for withdrawal, was released. At 0330 artillery and cannon fire was ordered held for five minutes, after which time all concentrations were fired to cover the withdrawal.

The first elements returned to la Walck at 0410, the remainder of the Company closing at approximately 0550. During the period of withdrawal litters were used to evacuate the casualties, who were carried across the bridge to Pfaffenhoffen (9127) and there placed in medical aid jeeps.

As a result of the raid nine prisoners were taken, three known machine guns and an unknown number of machine pistols were silenced by hand grenades; enemy dead were unknown. The casualties sustained by Company G were 1 killed, 6 missing and 18, including 2 officers, wounded. Of the latter 4 were returned to duty.

At a battalion inspection and review at 1400, General McAuliffe presented Bronze Star Medals to the following for their heroism during the raid: Capt Craddock; 1st Lt Avel O. Henneke, 0547560, Drummond, Okla; S/Sgt Ludovic P. Cogozzo, 36714107, Chicago, Ill; and Pvt Earl E Sprague, 31486854, Machias, Me.

The Regimental sector was otherwise quiet during the day. Front line battalions continued to improve positions and coordinated their fires with adjacent units. Patrols were active during the night but reported no contact with the enemy.

#### 9 February

The 1st and 3d Battalions continued improvement of primary and alternate positions on the MLR and installations of duckboards in MLR positions were completed. Patrols from front line battalions, active during the night, reported enemy activity in the vicinity of Kindwiller. Scattered artillery fire was received in the sector during the period. Three prisoners were cap-

tured in the vicinity of 928277. At 2000 Company C began the relief of Company A, completing it by 2545; Relief in position of Company I by Company L, begun at 2000, was accomplished by 2550.

#### 10 February

The 1st and 3d Battalions occupied the MLR and continued to strengthen their positions. Antitank and Cannon Companies made further improvements in their positions. A firing range was improvised and familiarization riving with the bazooka was conducted by the 2d Battalion. Enemy activity during the period was limited to scattered small groups observed in the woods east of Bitschhoffen (9128), and Kindwiller where vehicular movement was reported. Patrols from 1st and 3d Battalions made no contact with the enemy.

#### 11 February

The 1st and 3d Battalions occupied the OPL and MLR. The 1st Battalion sent out two patrols during the period. The 2d Battalion in reserve conducted familiarization firing of rifles, bazookas and rifle grenades. Instruction in the use of demolitions was conducted with selected group of officers and NCOs.

A & P Platoon painted trees bordering the road from Ringeldorf (9025) to Pfaffenhoffen white to aid in blackout driving. The 3d Battalion sent out three patrols. The Regimental Staff conjucted an inspection of all CP installations. The M4A5, new model tank, was sent through all towns where battalions were located in order to familiarize troops with its appearance. Personnel of Separate Companies studied appearance of tanks as they were en route.

#### 12 February

The 1st and 3d Battalions improved their positions. One platoon from each of Companies F, G and H worked on the RML; the remainder of the 2d Battalion continued in Regimental Reserve, and was subjected to a weapons inspection. Two patrols were sent out by the 3d Battalion and one PW was taken at 916282 following a brief skirmish.

#### 15 February

The 2d Battalion in reserve conducted schools on forward observation, bridge reconnaissance and use of bangalore torpedoes. One platoon each from Companies E, F and G continued work on ERL.

#### 14 February

The 1st En improved positions on the MLR. The 2d Battalion continued training and made plans to relieve the 1st, a move which was completed at 2545. The 1st Battalion moved into Regimental Reserve at Bueswiller (8724) to conduct training and rehabilitate itself. The 5d Battalion set ten trip flares in front of its forward positions and sent out two patrols that made no contact with the enemy.

#### 15 February

Defensive positions were maintained in the sector. The 1st Battalion in reserve engaged in the cleaning of personnel and equipment. The 1d Battalion prepared duck boards and covers for foxholes and improved defensive positions. The Battalion CP moved to Schalkendorf (8726). The 3d dug in a new OP. Reinforcements were integrated with their companies. Selected officers and NCOs attended school on forward observation in the afternoon. Battalion Intelligence Personnel attended orientation class with 552d Field Artillery Battalion on the composition of artillery targets. Two patrols sent out from the 3d Battalion, one to woods in the vicinity of 9527 and the other to Bitschhoffen, made no contact with the enemy.

#### 16 February

The 1st Battalion in reserve continued its cleaning of men, weapons, materials and quarters. The 2d and 3d Battalions occupied the MLR and OPLR, improving positions. The 2d Battalion brought mortar fire to bear on a smell enemy group at 908292 causing several casualties. The A&P Platoons of both battalions improved roads within their sectors. A patrol to point 932282 ehcountered an enemy patrol and received some small arms fire. They then proceeded to 920287 where they contacted a 15-man German patrol and a brief skirmish resulted. A second patrol moved to 903287, but made no contact. At the end of the period Company K was in the process of relieving Company L on the OPLR. Company L was moving to the positions formerly occupied by Company K.

#### 17 February

The 1st Battalion in reserve was inspected by General McAulifie at 0900. He pronounced it the finest looking battalion in the division. The 2d Battalion set 12 trip flares in its sector; the A&P platoon continued to improve roads and bridges. At 1400 mortar lire was placed on a group of six of the enemy east of Kindwiller with unobserved results. Three patrols made no contact.

#### 18 February

Front line troops occupied OPLE and MLR and continued to improve positions. The 1st Battalion in reserve followed a prescribed eight-hour training schedule for all personnel. Operations Instruction No. 62, Hq 105d Division, dtd 180800 Feb 45, was received. It directed that the Regiment coordinate relief of elements in present sector with the Commanding Officer, Combat Command B, 14th Armored Division, relief to be accomplished the night of 19-20 February; relieve elements of the 41th Infantry in the new sector during the night of 20-21 February, relief to be completed by 210800 February; and defend its new sector with not to exceed two battalions abreast. Necessary plans and reconnaissance were initiated to effect the change in boundary at the proper time. A raid in the vicinity of Ueberach (9227) was in progress as the period ended.

#### 19 February

The Regiment manned the OPLR and MLR in its sector. The Regimental CP closed at Ringendorf (8623) and opened at Bourwiller (8125) at 1400. The 1st Battalion in reserve test fired the carbine, M-1 rifle, BAR and machine guns. All Companies in the battalion except Company D saw the training film, "Your Job in Germany". The Battalion CP moved to Obermodern (6527). In the Ld Battalion 256 men viewed the training film; the A&P Platoon improved roads in the battalion zone. The 5d Battalion sent out one patrol which captured one PW. Approximately 250 men saw the training film. The Battalion CP moved to Rueswiller (8724). The 5d Battalion and elements of the 2d Battalion were relieved in position at 2254 by Combat Command B, 14th Armored Division, the 3d Battalion moving to Bueswiller. Company F (-1 Plat) and Company G moved to Schalkendorf (8726). One platoon of Company F organized positions in the vicinity of 888270.

#### 20 February

The MLR was occupied by Company E and a platoon of Company G. The 1st and 5d Battalions spent the period cleaning equipment and personnel, the 1st completing the test firing of all weapons in the battalion on a range in the vicinity of Bueswiller. The Cannon Company CP moved to Menchhoffen (825289), displaced one gun battery and fired one mission. The 3d platoon of Antitank Company assembled in Mechhoffen and the rest of the Company remained in position in support of the MLR.

#### 21 February

The 1st Battalion cared for and cleaned weapons after zeroing them in. The battalion began moving to Fourwiller (8125) at 1800 and closed into its new area at 2040. Relief of the 2d Battalion in its positions by the 410th Infantry commenced at dark and was completed at 2210, the battalion closing in Obersoultzbach (7928) at 2321. The 3d Battalion zeroed weapons and attended a lecture on what to do if captured which was given by an ETOUSA representative. Instruction was also given on the care of the feet. The battalion moved from Bueswiller (8724) to Bouxwiller, closing at 1840.

#### 22 February

Preparations were made for training while in Division Reserve. Reconmaissance was made for ranges and training areas. An inspection was conducted by the 1st Eattalion. The 2d Eattalion attended a lecture by an ENGUEA representative on that to do if captured. Road blocks and security patrols were instituted and counterattack plans for employment of the Regiment ascinst enemy penetration were drawn up.

#### 23 February

The Regiment remained in Division Reserve. Battalion Commanders and staifs made recommaissance for Regimental counterattack plans. Ranges were completed and readied for operation. All battalions and separate companies followed prescribed training schedules. Instruction in Allied and enemy mines was given to the 1st and 3d Battalions by an officer from Company A, 528th Engineer (C) Esttalion. The 3d Battalion was held on a two-hour alert status: Company A was on a 30-minute alert status.

#### 24 February

A special lecture on "Allied and Enemy Mines Used in This Theatre" was given to the 2d Battalion, AT and Cannon Companies. Training continued per schedule, the program for all units including security, physical training, conservation of equipment, close order drill and care of the feet. Work was beport this list Halket gun on a new assault course in the vicinity of 750242. Alert Co: K; alert Bn:

#### 25 February

Elements of the 1st and 5d Battalions manned road blocks. The 2d Battalion held a class on the employment of tanks with infantry given by an officer from the 756th Tank Battalion. Alert Co: L: alert Bn: 2d.

#### 26 February

All battalions attended a lecture on air support given by the Division Air Support Officer. Officers in the 5d Battalion attended a class in armor identification conducted by a representative from the 756th Tank Battalion. A Communications School under Regimental control was instituted for communications personnel. Elements of the 2d and 5d Battalions fired weapons on improvised ranges. Alert Co: I; alert Bn: 1st.

#### 27 February

The 2d and 3d Battalions received instruction in the identification of armored vehicles using 756th Tank Battalion vehicles as demonstrators. Conmunication training continued. A test run was made by Company B, the alert company. Assembly in Bosselshausen (8322) was completed 46 minutes after the alert and movement order was given to the 1st Battalion. A class in the use of flame throwers was conducted by a representative from the 328th Engineer (C) Battalion for selected officers of all units of the Regiment. Construction of the assault firing range was completed. Normal training schedules were followed by all Regimental units. Alert Co: B; alert Bn: 2d.

#### 28 February

The 1st Battalion conducted training for all rifle company personnel on the assault firing course. The 2d Battalion received instruction in the operation and employment of the flame thrower. Five illuminating shells per company were fired for demonstration purposes. All other elements conformed to the usual training schedule. Alert Co: B; alert Bn: öd.
