NARRATIVE OF OPERATIONS

SERET NARRATIVE OF OPERATIONS-MARCH 1945

The 410th Infantry sector was quiet as the month of March began. The 1st and 2nd Battalions maintained defensive positions, while the 3rd Battalion

remained in Regimental Reserve.

During the early morning hours of 2 March 45, artificial moonlight was used to illuminate the right part of the regimental sector. The enemy, it was believed, was using recording devices to simulate horses and motor vehicles in the hope of drawing our fire. At 0730 on 2 March 45, the 1st Platoon of Company A, 756th Tank Battalion, was relieved by the 3rd Platoon of the same company. One platoon of Company F relieved one platoon of Company E in support positions at 1730. At 1900 Company E began relief of Company G on the MIR, with Company G leaving one squad in position on the MIR to relieve one squad of Company F. This relief was completed at 1955.

During 3 March 45, all elements of the regiment, less the units on the front line, conducted inspections of individual men, quarters, and weapons. At 1115 a demonstration of rocket firing tanks was held in the vicinity of Zutzendorf, and at 1600 a similar demonstration was held in the vicinity of Schalkendorf. Patrolling was active during the night hours. Company A's patrol spotted two enemy machine gun positions. Company B's patrol observed enemy occupation of roads. A 2nd Battalion patrol established a listening post.

Many enemy flares were dropped to disrupt our patrols.

At 1200 on 4 March 45, the 3rd Platoon of Company A, 48th Tank Battalion, was attached per Division OI #66, vice the 3rd Platoon, Company A, 756th Tank Battalion, relieving the latter from attachment to the 410th Infantry. The new tank platoon moved into position at Zutzendorf. The 3rd Battalion began relieving the 1st Battalion on line at 1800. Relief was completed at 1945. One platoon of Company K and one platoon of Company L remained on the line. The 1st Battalion reverted to Regimental Reserve in the vicinity of Obermodern, companies A and B having moved from Zutzendorf.

A platoon from Company G relieved a platoon from Company F in reserve positions at 1735 on 5 March 45. One squad of Company E was left in position in the center of the sector. During the night of 5-6 March 45, a Company G patrol found one enemy position unoccupied, and a Company K patrol, making a reconnaissance of the main road into Neiffern and checking for mines, found no mines and heard some noises in Neiffern. Company L's patrol set up a listening post at 881304, and found no enemy personnel or positions. Eight rounds of enemy artillery landed in the woods where Company F's CP was located at 1100 on 6 March 45, but there was no damage. Mortar fire coming from Neiffern fell in the 3rd Battalion sector at 1111. During the afternoon, one tank fired direct fire into Neiffern. Two 2nd Battalion patrols went out on the night of 6-7 March 45. Patrol No. 1 did not accomplish its mine-laying mission and was fired on with a rifle grenade. Patrol No. 2 successfully laid mines and also discovered what was believed to be an enemy OP at 89302935. An L Company patrol heard German voices at 884291. It did not cross the creek because the area was well-lighted by fires burning in Kindwiller.

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The sector was still quiet on 7 March 45. At 1600, a heavy machine-gun from Company H fired incendiary ammunition into Kindwiller, and then repeated the action at 1900. Company F nabbed a German deserter at 2230. The PW said he was from the 5th Company of the 118th Regiment and that the whole company was in Kindwiller.

Another deserter was taken by Company F at 0815 on 8 March 45. He belonged to the 6th Company of the 118th Regiment. A tank fired direct fire into Neiffern at 1500 but drew no enemy fire. At 1800 Company G began relief of Company F on line. Company F left one squad in position in the middle of the sector. The relief was completed at 1930. At 1715, one platoon from Company E relieved one platoon of Company G in reserve positions.

Company G fired mortars at three Germans spotted at 887293 at 1045 on 9 March 45. The rounds were believed to be effective. Fifteen rounds of enemy mortar fell in the vicinity of Company K positions at 1300, and 12 rounds in the vicinity of Company G positions at 1730. Artillery fired into the NW part of Engwiller silenced this enemy fire. A platoon of Company I relieved a platoon of Company L at 1955. Company L moved to Obermodern and Company I, minus one platoon, moved to Zutzendorf.

The regiment, minus elements on the line, conducted inspections of individual soldiers, weapons, and quarters during the morning of 10 March 45. At 1000 Company H fired a 50 caliber machine gun into Kindwiller but drew no enemy fire.

Two Company K patrols returned during darkness of 10-11 March. Neither patrol secured any new information. During the afternoon of 11 March 45, nine rounds of enemy artillery fell in the vicinity of Obermodern. The 1st Battalion made preparations for the relief of the 2nd Battalion. The relief began at 1900 and was completed at 2345. Positions facing the Moder River were occupied by Company C with one platoon of Company A to its right to maintain contact with the 14th Armored Division. The 1st Battalion CP moved to Schalkendorf at 121155 March 45. The 2nd Battalion CP moved to Obermodern on 11 March and the battalion went into Regimental Reserve.

The 1st Platoon, Company C, 761st Tank Battalion, was attached at 0800 on 12 March 45. The tanks were held in the vicinity of Obermodern. The 3rd Battalion took two deserters from the 6th Company, 18th Regiment of the 36th Volksgrenadier Division at 0840 on 12 March 45. During the afternoon, squad problems were conducted by the 2nd Battalion on the Corps Combat Range in the vicinity of Saverne. At 1600 the 3rd Platoon, Company A, 48th Tank Battalion, was relieved from attachment.

The Regimental Sector remained quiet, with the 1st and 3rd Battalions maintaining an alert defense on 13 March 45.

Two patrols, one from the 2nd Battalion's Company F and one from the 3rd Battalion's Company K went out during the night of 12-13 March 45 to stay 24 hours behind enemy lines. The Company K patrol returned at 0530 on 13 March,

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because daylight caught the patrol before it could get started. The Company F patrol was still out. During the day all available troops attended a demonstration of the M-24 tank. The Company F 4-man patrol returned safely at 2320 and brought back information vital to future operations. The patrol had penetrated three miles into enemy territory.

On 14 March 45, Regimental OI #27 and 28 were issued, and the regiment made ready, in secrecy, to attack on D-Day, H-Hour (0645 on 15 March 1945).

The plan of operations called for the 103d Division to attack on the axis Bischholtz (08532)-Bobenthal (R0951) to capture the high ground in the vicinity of Climbach (R0846) and the vicinity of Bobenthal to uncover and penetrate the Siegfried Line in its zone, to capture the high ground in the vicinity of Dimbach (R1163) and north of Bergzabern (R1956), and to prepare to continue the attack to the East and/or Northeast. The 383rd Field Artillery Groupment (383d and 382d Field Artillery Battalions) were to be in direct support of the 410th Infantry. Company B of the 328th Engineers (C) Battalion was to support

The mission of the 410th Infantry was to secure the crossing of LaZintzel DuNord River in the vicinity (921339) and the crossing of the Falkenstein River in the vicinity (Q942340); to seize Phase Line B in its zone on order (Phase Line B of the Division ran through Neiderbronn, Reichshoffen and Gundershoffen) to seize high ground in the vicinity of Climbach; to be prepared to assist the 411th Infantry to capture the high ground in the vicinity of Bobenthal; and thereafter be prepared to attack on order to breach the Siegfried Line in our zone and continue attack to the north. The main effort was to be on the left. By battalions the missions were as follows: The First Battalion, to which was attached the 1st Platoon, Company A, 614th Tank Destroyer Battalion, as to seize Phase Line B in its gone with the utmost spped and be prepared to capture Gundershoffen, or to continue the attack in zone, on Regimental Order. The 2nd Battalion was to pass through the 3rd Battalion and secure crossing of the La Zintzel DuNord River in the vicinity of (Q921339) and the crossing of the Falkenstein River in the vicinity (Q94340); to seize Phase Line B in its zone and be prepared to continue attack in its zone on Regimental Order. The 3rd Battalion, to which was attached the 1st Platoon, Company C, 761st Tank Battalion, was to attack Neiffern with one Company (K) which, upon capture of the town, would revert to Regimental Reserve. The remainder of the battalion was to follow the 2nd Battalion closely, capture Uhrwiller, be prepared to seize the high ground northwest of Engwiller, and capture Engwiller on Regimental Order; also to maintain contact with the 411th Infantry on the left. The Battalion was to revert to Regimental Reserve upon capturing Engwiller.

The Anti-Tank Company was initially to be in Regimental Reserve to protect the flanks and rear of the regiment from any mechanized attack. The company was to assemble the mine platoon in the vicinity of Obermodern at H-Hour, D-Day and be prepared to move to Zutzendorf and/or further northeast on Regimental Order. The Cannon Company was to be in direct support of the 3rd Battalion.

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Company A of the 614th TDs was to attach one platoon to the 1st Battalion. Its initial position would be in the present battalion sector to permit direct fire into Kindwiller. One platoon attached to the 3rd Battalion was to take up an initial position in the present 3rd Battalion sector to permit direct fire into Uhrwiller. The TD Company (less 2 platoons) was to protect the front and flanks of the regiment against any mechanized attack, and be prepared for possible employment as regimental reserve on Regimental Order.

Company B, 83rd Chemical Mortar Battalion, attached as of 1200 on 14, March 45, was to smoke Neiffern, Uhrwiller, Kindwiller from present positions, starting D-Day, H-Hour, and was to cease firing on Regimental Order. After smoke firing ceased the company was to be prepared to move forward promptly on Regimental Order.

The I&R Platoon was to man Regimental OP's, conduct road reconnaissance in zone on order; be prepared to maintain contact with the 411th Infantry on the left and the 143rd on the right on order. The order stated that speed was paramount in the attack. The plan called for hostile centers of resistance by the assault echelons. Priority on artillery fire was given to the 2nd Battalion.

The advance Regimental CP opened at Zutzendorf (864284) at 2000 on 14 March 1945.

A tremendous artillery barrage signalled D-Day, H-Hour. The regiment jumped-off at 0645 with two battalions abreast—the 1st and 2nd Battalions attacking, with the 1st on the right.

The 1st Battalion moved forward in a column of companies with Company A the spearhead. No organized resistance which could not be by-passed or quickly crushed was met until 0818, when the enemy was contacted to the west of Utten-hoffen. At approximately 1000 Company A was held up by intense 88, mortar and sniper fire, most of which was coming from the town of Uttenhoffen. Company B. in attempting to by-pass this resistance, was in turn pinned down to the left rear of Company A. Company C was then committed in an attempt to take the town. They advanced to positions in front of Uttenhoffen. Reconnaissance from the attack disclosed that four enemy tanks were hidden in the town, but, after bringing down a heavy artillery concentration, Company C attacked. The company was unable to enter the town because of direct fire from the tanks. Nightfall found the battalion's front lines approximately 300 yards short of Uttenhoffen, with the troops unable to take the town because of the enemy tanks. Action subsided with nightfall, and the Battalion CP was established at Mietesheim. Many casualties were incurred from the day's heavy fighting. At 2130, the Regimental Commander ordered the battalion to tie in with the 3rd Battalion (which had occupied Engwiller) by patrols.

The 2nd Battalion's advance in the left of the Regimental Sector met strongly entrenched enemy forest positions. Within 20 minutes after the jump-off an enemy outpost was encountered on the high ground between Kindwiller and Uhrwiller. The battalion drew a little fire but took 12 prisoners and continued on, west of Engwiller, attempting to by-pass the west side of the woods. The

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enemy allowed Company E to get approximately opposite the northwest corner of the woods and then opened up with machine guns and mortars from strongly defended positions to pin down the company. This happened at approximately 1200. The rest of the battalion slowly moved by infiltration to the left flank to get to the other side of the road, which had a protecting embankment. Companies F and G then smashed into the forest bunkers. Company E crawled through a culvert to escape the fire, then joined in the attack to clean up the forest. By 1700 the battalion had rounded up more than 200 prisoners. After this, the battalion cleaned up the woods completely, suffering casualties from artillery and mortar fire, and reached the northeast edge of the woods where SP fire was drawn from the high ground north of Engwiller. The battalion threw up a perimeter defense for the night.

The 3rd Battalion sent out Company K to take Neiffern as its first objective in the attack. Tanks supporting Company K finished firing at 0700 and the troops began moving into town. The tanks attempted also to enter the town, but two tanks were disabled in combined AT and AP mine fields and the attempt had to be abandoned. By 0740 Neiffern was cleared to the creek. Company K finished clearing Neiffern at 1125 and at 1211 was ordered to move to an area southeast of Uhrwiller.

A TD platoon, acting as Infantry, cleared the town of Kindwiller by 1120.

Poor visibility from the smoke screen held up the 3rd Battalion's capture of Uhrwiller. Company L reported visibility zero at 0910. By 1050, Company L had two platoons in Uhrwiller and one at the rear of town. Company I also had two platoons in town. The town was quickly cleared. Because of the existing situation of the 2nd Battalion, the Regimental Commander ordered the battalion to seize the hostile positions in and near Engwiller. Companies I and L hit Engwiller at 1830. The 3rd Battalion CP opened at Uhrwiller at 1915. Company I finished cleaning out its portion of Engwiller by 1930. Company I finished its portion soon afterwards.

The Regimental CP moved to Uhrwiller (884306) opening there at 1840.

The second day of the attack, 16 March 45, began with Phase Line B as the initial objective. At 0700 the 3rd Battalion jumped off from the vicinity of Engwiller to seize Gumbrehtshoffen. Company L found the creek mined when it left the north edge of the woods on the road from Gumbrechthoffen to Uttenhoffen. After a five-minute Cannon Company preparation, the battalion jumped-off into town at 0920, Company I and Company L hitting the north portion of the town and Company K the south. The battalion repulsed a counterattack at 1405 which emanated from the woods at (923347). By later in the afternoon, the battalion had cleared the town. The period ended with the 3rd Battalion remaining there, protecting the left flank of the regiment.

At 1100 that day, the 2nd Battalion followed the 3rd Battalion and moved north of the road which runs east about a kilometer north of Engwiller down to the stream. Its mission was to capture Gundershoffen, starting its attack as soon as 3rd Battalion had a secure foothold in Gumbrectshoffen. The battalion crossed

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the stream at 1315, using smoke and artiflery to cover. Companies F and G led the attack. The companies crossed 2500 yards of open terrain, with the object of seizing Gundershoffen by coming in from the west side of town. The enemy allowed the troops to come within 800 yards of town, and then, from long trenches in which they had set up, hit the battalion with mortar fire and machine gun cross-fire. By infiltration, a platoon of Company F got into town at 1500 and held one building in the end of town, but the remainder of the battalion was pinned down here until nightfall. The battalion advanced when it grew dark, crossed the stream at night, and seized a bridghead by 2400 which would allow engineers to build a bridge early the next morning.

At the close of the period, the Battalion buttoned up in its positions in town.

The 1st Battalion resumed its attack at 161200 March 45 with Uttenhoffen as its immediate objective. This action involved Companies B and C, with Company C on the right. Clearing of the town was completed at 1400 and these two companies continued forward, waded the Zintzel River, and fought their way to the high ground east of Gundershoffen by 2115. The battalion remained there for the night, tying in with the 143rd Infantry on the right by patrols.

The Regimental CP opened at Engwiller (912317) at 2050 that day.

The 2nd Battalion jumped off at 0620 on 17 March 45 to clean up the rest of Gundershoffen. The town was completely secured at 0750. The 409th Infantry passed through the battalion at 0800.

During the afternoon, the 410th Infantry (minus the 1st Battalion) was placed in Division reserve. The Regimental CP opened at Gundershoffen (945340) at 1635. During the afternoon the 2nd and 3rd Battalions moved to the vicinity of Schirlenhof.

Company B, 83rd Chemical Battalion, was relieved from attachment at 0230 on 17 March 45. At 2100 the same day, Company A, 614th TD Battalion, was relieved from attachment.

The 1st Battalion was informed by the Regimental Commander at 0137 on 17 March 45 that it was being attached to the 409th Infantry. FO #17, Hq 409th Infantry was received at 170530 ordering the battalion to remain in its positions and support the attack of the 409th Infantry which, after passing through the 410th Infantry, was to seize the high ground in the vicinity of Climbach. When its fire was masked the battalion reverted to regimental reserve of the 409th Infantry. The battalion moved by foot march to Eberbach, closing in the latter town at approximately 1545. 18 March 45 found the battalion still in reserve. At 0922 the troops moved out by foot march for Mitschdorf, closing there by 1200. At 181400 March 45, the battalion reverted to the 410th Infantry, and at 1707 orders were received to move the battalion to Climbach. The troops moved out at 1800 and closed in Climbach at 2330.

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On 18 March 45, the Regimental CA opened at Froeschwiller (992391) at 1050. The 3rd Battalion closed into the woods north of that town at 1115. Shortly thereafter, the 2nd Battalion also closed in the assembly area in the vicinity of Froeschwiller.

The Regimental CP moved to Mattstall, opening there at 1630 that day. The 3rd Battalion closed into an assembly area in the vicinity of Wingen at 1930 that day, with 2nd Battalion closing in the same area at 2100. The Regimental CP opened at Wingen (059474) at 1935. The 1st Battalion remained at Climbach.

On 19 and 20 March 45, the Regiment remained in its same positions, in Division Reserve, maintaining close liaison with the 411th Infantry and preparing to relieve that Regiment on Division Order.

The Regiment was still in reserve as 21 March 45 began, but the Division Commander verbally ordered the Regimental Commander to start movement of the Battalions to assembly areas in the woods south and southeast of Bobenthal, Germany, to prepare for the relief of the 411th Infantry. The 2nd Battalion moved over the German border and closed into its area at 0955. The 3rd Battalion closed at 1000. Both battalions were located about one mile south of Bobenthal. The 1st Battalion moved to a point two and a half miles north of Climbach, just across the German border. This marked the first time that all the Regimental front-line elements were in Germany together.

Division OI #72, dated 212000A, ordered the 103d Division to continue the attack on the axis Bobenthal (R0951)-Landau (R2766), capturing Landau and securing the Rhine River crossing in the vicinity of Germersheim (R4669). Attached to the 410th Infantry as of 212000 March 45 were the 3rd Battalion of the 41lth Infantry (for operations only); Company C (minus one platoon), 761st Tank Battalion; Company C, 83rd Chemical Mortar Battalion; Company A, 614th TD Battalion, and one platoon, Battery C, 991st Field Artillery Battalion (155 Gun Self-Propelled).

The 410th Infantry was to attack thru the 411th Infantry on the axis Nieder Schlettenbach (R0854)-Erlenbach (R0957) to seize Phase Line S (eastwest line through Landau) in its zone, capturing Landau. Thereafter, the 410th Infantry was to be prepared to attack to the Rhine River. The Regiment was to serve also as the protection for the Division's left flank. The 1st Battalion was to remain assembled in the vicinity of (R105495) in Division Reserve. At approximately 1900 on 21 March 45 the 2nd Battalion began relief of the 2nd Battalion of the 411th Infantry on the line. The 3rd Battalion simultaneously was relieving the 1st Battalion of the 411th Infantry.

The Regimental CP opened at Bobenthal, Germany (088566) at 2215.

The 3rd Army and 7th Army were moving so swiftly in the forging of the Saar trap that plans could not be formulated too far in advance. The 410th Infantry's mission of capturing Erlenbach was to close the jaws on the trapped enemy.

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The 2nd battalion completed its relief of the 41th Infantry elements by 0230. Companies E and F were on Hill 7, having relieved Company F of the 41th Infantry. Our Company G relieved their Company G. Our 3rd Battalion completed relief at 0510. Company K was on the left and Company L was on the right. The 41th Infantry's 3rd Battalion had a platoon on Hill 11.

The 3rd Battalion of the 410th Infantry and the 3rd Battalion of the 411th Infantry jumped off at 0800 22 March 45 to drive through the West Wall, through the mountains to the open country, and then race to the Rhine. The Regimental CP moved forward to Nieder Schlettenbach (081540) at 0815.

Slowly at first and then more rapidly, the troops by-passed and smashed the bunkers and forts of the Wall. At 1645 the 3rd Battalion of the 411th Infantry captured Erlenbach. At 2030 the 3rd Battalion of the 410th Infantry closed in the vicinity of that town after cleaning up hills and forts on the flanks. At the end of the period the 2nd Battalion, which had cleaned out the hills north and west of Nieder Schlettenbach, remained in position north, northeast and northwest of that town. The Division Commander ordered the regiment to hold these positions until further orders. Meanwhile, the 1st Battalion on 22 March 45, moved to a designated area in the vicinity of Reisdorf, closing there at 1130. Later the same day, the battalion, less one platoon of Company C and one squad from the AT platoon, which were left as a road block, moved northeast to the vicinity of Birkendorf, closing at 2040.

Verbal orders through the Chief of Staff received at 0740 on 23 March 45, called for the Regimental Commander to move out his leading foot troops without delay in pursuit of the disorganized enemy, the remainder of the regiment and attachments to follow by way of Vard Weidenthal-Silz-Stein.

The Regimental CP opened at Erlenbach (093570) at 0915.

The 3rd Battalion, hand-carrying its heavy weapons, moved out at 0950 toward Vord Weidenthal headed for Gobersweiler. The attached 3rd Battalion, 411th Infantry, followed our 3rd Battalion without distance but, at Vord Weidenthal, turned right toward Silz en route to Gocklingen. At 1145 the Regimental CP closed at Erlenbach and moved out by motor, following closely the foot troops of the 2nd Battalion, and leading the motor elements of the regiment and attached units. At 1245 the 3rd Battalion captured a complete artillery battalion, with four 155mm howitzers, all personnel and equipment. At 1435 the Regimental Commander ordered the 3rd Battalion to make its destination Leinswiller and to block roads to the rear. The period ended with the 3rd Battalion at Leinswiller, having captured about 500 prisoners. The Battalion had cleared Vord Weidenthal, Grosserweiler, and Volkersweiler. The 2nd Battalion mopped up the woods in the vicinity of Neider Schlettenbach and moved to Gocklingen. The 3rd Battalion of the 411th Infantry cleared up isolated pockets of resistance in the vicinity of Stein and Waldrohbach, captured nearly 500 prisoners, and closed in Gocklingen as the period ended. The Regimental motor caravan ended in Gocklingen, having bull-dozed about 400 yards of new road enroute to by-pass a large abattis.

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The Regimental CP opened in Gocklingen at 2230.

The period had marked a complete demoralization of the enemy. Rearechelon units were capturing prisoners. A group of 54 Germans was taken by one soldier of our 3rd Battalion who dropped out of the column to rest. All during the day and night Germans were surrendering in small and large groups. German towns had white flags waving from the windows as American Troops raced through and around them. Troops were advancing so rapidly that it was a common sight to see German PW's walking back to PW cages without guards.

The 1st Battalion, meanwhile, was attached to the 409th Infantry, effective 230126 March 45, and took over the defense of Birkendorf. One platoon of the 614th TDs and one platoon of the 409th Infantry's AT Company was attached to the battalion at 0320. During the day an enemy ammunition DP was located and its position reported to the 409th Infantry. The same day, the battalion was ordered to Klingenmunster and closed there at 1905. At 2130 the battalion reverted back to the 410th Infantry. At 0735 on 24 March 45 the 1st Battalion was ordered to Eschbach and opened a Battalion CP there at 1445.

On 24 March 45 the regiment was alerted as a task force to cross the Rhine at Germersheim if the bridge was still intact, but when word came that the bridge was out, the task force was dissolved. The 3rd Battalion CP remained in Leinswiller, the Anti-Tank Company was in Wald Hambach, the Cannon Company in Gocklingen. The Regiment was now in Corps Reserve with the rest of the Division. The day was spent in care and cleaning of equipment, maintenance of vehicles, cleaning up of roads, and surveying of captured and destroyed enemy equipment.

On 25 and 26 March 45 the Regiment was still in reserve, and serving as protection for supply lines in the sector. Enemy troops hiding in the hills were still giving themselves up. Patrols enforced non-fraternization rules. Regimental personnel were being billeted in houses in a segregated part of the towns in which they were located. Curfew hours were established for civilians.

At 0930 27 March 45 the 1st Battalion Commander reported to the Commanding General of the 35th AAA Brigade in the city of Landau to receive orders pertaining to the defense of the VI Corps rear area, since the Battalion was now attached to the 35th AAA Brigade. At 1600 that afternoon, Company C moved to Landau to furnish security for the VI Corps CP. The 1st Battalion situation remained unchanged through 30 March 45. At 0740 on 31 March 45, Company C was relieved except for one 12-man guard post and returned to Eschbach. The 1st Battalion reverted to its parent regiment at 2400 on 31 March 45.

On 28 March 45 the regiment (minus the 1st Battalion) in accordance with Division OI #73, made preparations to relieve the 5th Infantry of the 71st Division along the Rhine River. After completion of relief by 291200 March 45, the regiment was to defend its sector with minimum forces, maintaining a maximum of reserves. Each front line battalion was to conduct one patrol per night across the Rhine River.

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The Regiment crossed the IP at 1630. The 3rd Battalion, with a CP at Waldsee, closed in its new area and began relief of elements of the 5th Infantry at 2345. Companies I and K were on line. Cannon Company and Anti-Tank Company closed into assembly areas in Neuhoffen at 2350. The 2nd Battalion closed into its area at 2220. Its CP was at Rheingonheim.

The Regimental CP opened at Neuhoffen, Germany (502916) at 2000. By 0120 on 29 March 45, the relief was completed and at 0157 the 410th Infantry's Regimental Commander assumed command of the sector.

Ten rounds of enemy artillery landed in Company I's area at 1300. During the period several enemy deserters were picked up by front line elements. A patrol consisting of seven men of the Regimental I&R Platoon and two 328th Engineers crossed the Rhine at midnight in an assault boat to determine enemy occupation on the east side of the Rhine. The patrol found enemy entrenchments unoccupied.

Division OI #74, dated 291800 March 45, called for the continued defense of the Rhine River line in the sector. The 411th Infantry was to relieve elements of the 410th Infantry (our 3rd Battalion).

At 1435 on 30 March 45, elements of our 3rd Battalion were relieved by the 41lth Infantry. Company I was attached to the 2nd Battalion, and at 1530 the 3rd Battalion (minus Company I) closed into Limburgerhof. At 1610 the 2nd Platoon of Battery C, 353 AAA Searchlight Battalion, was attached to the 410th Infantry.

As the month ended, the regiment continued outposting the Rhine, and conducted searches of buildings in the zone for enemy personnel, arms, and equipment.


