NARRATIVE OF OPERATIONS--APRIL 1945

As the month of April 1945 opened, the Regiment continued outposting the Rhine River. Plans were made on the 1st of April 45 for movement to new areas in accordance with Division OI's 75 and 76, which called for the 103d Division to prepare to garrison, police and support military government in its area.

Attached to the 410th Infantry were Company B, 328th Engineer (C) Battalion and one battery of the 534th AAA Battalion.

During the 1st of April 45 Company G was assigned the task of screening the male population of Altrip, and completed its mission at 1430.

The Hollywood star, Marlene Dietrich, entertained soldiers of the 2nd Battalion during the morning of 2 April 1945.

On the same morning, time was moved forward one hour.

Elements of the Regimental Combat Team began a movement to the new area at 1400. The Regimental CP opened at Annweiler (171672) at 1500. The Regimental Commander ordered all units to conduct immediate reconnaissance of new areas and to contact the Military Government.

The 3rd Battalion closed at 1100 on 3 April 45, and the last elements of the 2nd Battalion at 1200. The 383rd Field Artillery was in the vicinity of Landau; the Cannon Company at Albersweiler; Anti-tank Company at Haverstein; 1st Battalion CP at Eschbach; Company A at Billigheim; Company B at Wald Rohrbach; Company D at Wollmesheim; Company C in the same town as Battalion; 2nd Battalion CP was at Bergzabern; Company E, attached to Regimental Headquarters, was in Annweiler; Company F in Hergersweiler; Company G west of Birkenhardt; Company H at Schweighofen; the 3rd Battalion CP was at Dahn; Company I at Fishbach; Company K at Dahn; Company L at Bundenthal; Company M at Hinter Weidenthal; and Company B, 328th Medical Battalion at Landau.

Civilian passes were left to the discretion of battalion commanders. Screening of civilians commenced. Houses were searched. Curfews were set. Road Blocks were posted. Enforcement of all provisions of military government began.

On 3 April 1945 the Regimental I & R Platoon investigated Castle Trifels on a hill overlooking Annweiler. This famous castle was Richard the Lion Hearted's prison for 12 years on his return from the Crusades, and also served as the storeroom for the Crown Jewels when Germany had emperors.

At 1040 on 3 April 45, the 383rd FA found five boxcars loaded with small arms ammunition and chemical warfare supplies. A guard was put on the cars. The misplaced personnel section reported it was getting food for freed slave labor from Siegfried line forts. Prisoners were picked up by patrols of Cannon Company, L Company and the 383rd FA during the day.

Company C was alerted on 4 April 45 for movement to Landau where armed Russians were on the warpath seeking to shoot Germans. The situation, however, was brought under control. At 1430 Anti-tank Company was told it was permissible for civilians to start the shoe factory in their town in operation. At 1740 Cannon Company discovered a range southeast of Dunbach, containing 500 pound bombs and much small arms ammunition.

Company E found an ammunition dump on 5 April 45 at 1165-6549 among the highway leading up to the mountains. The dump had been covered by dried brush.

The 3rd Battalion reported at 1850 that the schoolhouse at Dahn was full of army blankets and rations. The Regimental Ammunition Officer reported that anything above the size of 20 MM German ammunition was not to be moved. The same applied to explosives such as TNT and hand grenades.

Division OI 78, dated 062000 April 45, called for the 103d Division to move across the Rhine commencing 071200 April 45 to garrison, police, and support the Military Government in its new area. The 410th Combat Team was ordered to submit by 072000 plans for garrison and control of the new areas.

On 7 April 45 the CT moved across the Rhine to begin garrison operations in the new area in the 7th Army rear. The route was Hafsloch-Machenheim-Museenstadt and across the river at Mannheim. The Regimental CP opened at Schriesheim (673979) at 1830 and was followed at 2130 by Company B, 328th Medical Battalion. The 2nd Battalion, with Cannon Company attached, closed in at 2130. The Battalion CP was at Schweitzingen; Cannon Company at Friedrichsfield; Company E at Heidelberg; Company F at Weisloch; Company G at Kirchheim; Company H at Bruhl. The 3rd Battalion closed at 2150, its CP being at Schonau. Company I was at Neckarsteinach; Company K at Hirschorn; Company L at Ob Flockenbach; Company M at Wilhelmsfeld. The 383rd Field Artillery closed in Weinheim at 1945.

The 1st Battalion closed in its assigned area at 1000 on 8 April 45. Battalion Headquarters and Company A were established in Eberbach; Company B in Strumpfelbrunn, Company C in Lohrbach, and Company D in Waldkatzenbach. The Anti-Tank Company was in Dossenheim, the AA Battery in Waldhof, Company B, 328th Engineers in Mannheim Stad Airfield.

On 8 April 45 the Regiment was ordered to take over the guarding of all 7th Army installations in Heidelberg now guarded by Company C, 1269th Engineer Battalion. Company E was assigned the mission and took over on the morning of 9 April 45.

The Regimental CP moved to Neunheim (69-91) on the morning of 9 April 45, opening there at 1400. Cannon Company moved to Mannheim, and Company B, 328th Engineers was relieved from assignment to the 410th Infantry and reverted to its parent unit. At 1615 there was a riot in Heidelberg between misplaced personnel and German civilians. Company G sent 60 men to quell it, but reported everything under control shortly after arrival on the scene.

The IPW Officer and the CO of Company F captured a Doctor Walter in the hospital at Weisloch. Papers found in a locked pedestal proved him a high-ranking Nazi in charge of sterilization and race culture for this district of Germany. A list showing the doctors in charge of the other eight districts was unearthed also. The doctor was turned over to Civil Affairs authorities.

On 10 April 45 the Regiment continued its garrison duties. The 1st Battalion found a diesel engine manufacturing plant in Eberbach still in operation. The plant was taken over and placed under guard. The 3rd Battalion reported finding a shoe factory with thousands of pairs of shoes. Owing to lack of facilities for handling the large number of misplaced personnel who could not be evacuated immediately, the regiment's troops maintained supervision over housing and feeding these people.

There was no change in troop dispositions on 11 and 12 April 45. The regiment continued the garrison, police and support of the Military Government. Company I checked all barges on the Neckar River in their area and Company K did likewise.

On the 13th of April 45 plans were made to carry out orders of the directive, Hq 103d Division, dated 1900B 13 April 45. The RCT was to protect supply installations, security railroads, main supply roads, petroleum pipe lines, and critical signal installations. The Regiment was to gather into the Displaced Persons Center all displaced personnel who were migrating or disorderly or who were security hazards. The disarming and police of civilians as requested by the Military Government would be conducted also. In accordance with this directive, elements of the 410th relieved 7th Army Security Guard posts of the 1st Battalion, 65th Infantry, and 698th Field Artillery Battalion on 14 April 45. Company F moved to Friedrichsfield (61-94). One platoon of the AT Company moved into Weisloch (70-77). Eleven men of the I and R platoon were attached to Cannon Company to guard the telephone exchange in the vicinity of Mannheim (53-99). During the early morning of 14 April 45, two bombs were dropped by an enemy plane in the vicinity of the bridge site between Heidelberg and Neunheim. At 2315 another enemy plane fired bursts from its machine guns at the same location.

The 383rd Field Artillery was informed on 15 April 45 that permission had been given to open the factories in Weinheim and the issuance of passes for people in suburban towns to go to work. At 1800 the security guard posts on the University Library in Heidelberg were discontinued. Elements of the Regimental MP Platoon established security guard posts on the University Library in Heidelberg.

On 16 April 45, the 3rd Battalion CP moved to Neckarsteinach (R7990), closing in at 1400. Company M had relieved Company E in Heidelberg (R6990) by 1200 and Company E closed into Weisloch (R7077) at 1415. By 1200 Company I had relieved Company G and Company G had closed into Ketsch (R5785). Company I also relieved the MP Platoon at the Library Post in Heidelberg.

Cannon Company took over the I & R Platoon Guard at the telephone exchange in Mannheim. An AT Company Platoon moved out of Weisloch to guard the 7th Army Ordnance Collecting Point in Heidelberg.

There was no change in troop disposition on 17 April 45.

An overlay was received from Division showing the regiment's future assembly area. Division OI 81, dated 182100 April 45, ordered the 103d upon relief of its present security mission, to move to an assembly area south of Ohringen (S2868) to prepare for commitment to action. Battery A, 534th AAA, was to be released from attachment effective upon arrival in the new area.

By 1100 on 18 April 45, Companies I and M had been relieved by elements of Company L of the 65th Infantry. Battery A of the 534th and Cannon Company were relieved by Company I of the 65th at 1900. Elements of all companies (minus elements on security guard posts) assembled in the vicinity of company areas. The Regiment received word at 1200 that the Division was back in the 6th Corps. Verbal orders were received from Division at 2140 that the Regiment would move at 1400 on 19 April 45. Sixty ducks were to be supplied for the move. There was to be 10 minutes between march units and 30 minutes between serials. The route would be across the bridge at Heidelberg, then east to Neckargemund and then south to Sinslein. The IP would be at the south end of the bridge.

The Regiment was relieved of its guard posts and began a motor move on 19 April 45 to the assembly area south of Ohringen. The Regimental CP opened at Adolzfurt (S2464) at 2230. The 3rd Battalion closed into Geddelsbach at 1815. Cannon Company was in Adolzfurt by 1840 and the 383rd FA at Scheppach by 1940. The 2nd Battalion crossed the IP at 2100 and closed into Unter Heimbach at 0300 on 20 April 45. The 1st Battalion crossed the IP at 0555 on 20 April 45 and closed into Holden at 0900.

Division OI 82, dated 201200 April 45, ordered the 103d to pass through elements of the 44th and 100th Divisions, commencing 20 April 45. Attached to the 410th Infantry were Company B, 328th Engineer Combat Battalion, Company A, 83rd Chemical Mortar Battalion, Company A, 614th TD Battalion, and one platoon of the 103d Cavalry Reconnaissance Troop. In conformance with verbal orders, the RCT was to move by motor without delay to the vicinity of Welzheim (S3932). The 410th Infantry was to pass through elements of the 44th Division in its zone. The initial objective of its attack was the vicinity of Pluderhausen, and then the Regiment was to be prepared to attack in the vicinity of Kirchheim (S2606). Liaison was to be established and maintained with the 44th Div on the left (East) and the 100th Division on the right (West) until RCT 411 was committed on the right. Thereafter the 410th would maintain contact with the 44th on that flank. The Regiment remained motorized as directed on 20 April 45. The Combat team moved south partly in the zone of the 44th in order to close on the town of Pluderhausen from two directions. The CP of the Regiment opened at Welzheim (S3932) at 2100.

The 1st Battalion awaited orders at HOLDEN, then moved to WELZHEIM, closing in there at 2000. The 2nd Battalion moved out of UNTER HEIMBACH at 1725 and stopped in WELZHEIM, at 2130 for further orders. No enemy action was encountered. The 3rd Battalion moved out from its CP at GEDDES BACH at 1600 to push on with utmost speed. As the period ended the Battalion was moving by motor from LORCH (S4324) toward UHINGEN (S3613).

All elements of the CT were moving by motor as far as possible with plans to continue the attack after detrucking. The division, which was to clean up after the spearheading 10th Armored, was pushing forward with utmost speed because of reports of infiltration behind the 10th Armored.

The Regiment made rapid progress on the 21st. The 1st Battalion sent companies A and B in to clear OBRAURBACH in the morning, after advancing through the woods South of BRETTFURST (S3830). Then the Battalion cleared PLUDERHAUSEN by 1330, and moved on to UHINGEN at 1515. Then the Motorized Battalion continued on to WEILHEIM, closing in there at 2345.

The 2nd Battalion moved by motor from WELZHEIM at 0245 to RATTERHARTZ, closing in at 0530, and prepared for the attack. The Regimental CO ordered the 2nd Battalion to clear the wooded ridge South of UNTERUNBACH. At 0730 the Battalion moved out to clear the woods several kilometers East of BREECH, (S3920) with "F" Company on the right and "E" on the left. By 1100 the woods were cleared and the Battalion (minus Company E, which was cleaning out UNTER and OBER BERKEN) assembled North of ADELBERG with orders to march south to UHLINGEN, having encountered no opposition. "E" Company arrived there at 1830 with 175 PW's. At 1900 the Battalion moved out on personnel carriers to SCHLIERBACH, and was continuing South at the close of the period.

The 3rd Battalion CP opened at 0400 in UHINGEN, and at 1045 movement started to KIRCHEIM where the CP opened at 1820. There the Battalion relieved elements of the 10th Armored Division and established positions protecting the Division right flank. At 1920 a column of Germans five miles long was reported closing in on KIRCHEIM. Allied air power was called for and wreaked havoc with the enemy column. At 1945 a captain from the 411th reported a command group of that regiment pinned down in the vicinity of KIRCHEIM. At 2023 a platoon from "L" Company of the 410th set out to relieve them. Chemical mortars threw smoke just before darkness and at 2205 the command group was in the Battalion CP having escaped from the ambush.

By the end of the day the Regiment had advanced over 10 kilometers in its sector against light opposition.

The Regiment continued to attack South in its sector on the 22nd with the 2nd Battalion on the right and 1st on the left.

The 2nd Battalion moved out by motor from Schlierbach at 0400 with "G" Company as a motorized patrol leading. No enemy action had been encountered at 1500 at which time the Battalion set up road blocks at Owen, Brucken, and

Unter and Ober Lenningen, with Companies E, F, and G manning the respective posts. In Ober Lenningen a civilian shot his family of three including a girl of about six and then hung himself when the Americans entered town. At 1820 Company G moved out to seize Ergenbrechtswiller and by 2113 had secured the town. The 2nd Battalion had also cleared Naben, Bessingen and Ochsenwang during the day. The 1st Battalion sent Company C to clear Niedlingen and Company B to clear Hepisau, both being accomplished by 0930. Then Company C moved on to clear Schopfloch. The Battalion CP moved to the latter town after Company C cleared it while Company B was clearing Gutenberg. In the first house taken in Gutenberg a civilian said there were no German soldiers in town. Nevertheless the company flushed out 45 enemy soldiers in town. The civilian made prisoner number 46. Company A set out to take Bohringen but met heavy resistance and was pinned down. Company C was clearing out Zaingen as the period ended. The 3rd Battalion sent Company K to capture Haringen where it was reported 100 enemy were holding out. No enemy was encountered and the town was cleared by 1750. The Battalion moved to Weilheim, closing there at 2050.

During the day, Regiment opened a CP at Weilheim (330-032) at 0800 and at 2315 moved to Gutenberg (317-944). The day brought hundreds of prisoners into the Regimental net as the Division advanced 15 kilometers south against disorganized resistance.

On the morning of 23 April 45, the 1st Battalion CP moved to Zanningen. With Company A pinned down outside of Bohringen, Company C was committed to the right and the town was cleared by 1540. When evidence was found of civilian sniping, and the changing by German soldiers into civilian clothes, the town was burned to the ground. The Battalion was moving through a military maneuver area where OCS candidates were trained for the German Army. Encountered were sample dragons teeth, pillboxes, trench fortifications, etc., all used for study and practice. All were undefended. Company B found 45 OCS candidates sitting down to dinner when it captured Gruorn. Then Company B moved on to take Trailfingen. The 2nd Battalion encountered obstinate and fanatical resistance in Ergenbrechtswiller. Company F moved in at 0400 to help out Company G which was meeting severe counterattacks. At 0600, Company G counterattacked but lost 17 men captured and two-thirds of the north section of the town. At 0715, Company E moved out to the town but was unable to advance beyond the top of the plateau because of machine gun fire coming from the east woods. The 2nd Battalion Commander took a platoon and proceeded to flush out this obstruction and Company E entered Ergenbrechtswiller. At noon a German SS officer carrying a white flag on his rifle and accompanied by one of the captured Company G doughboys. The German was taken to the CO of Co G and issued an ultimatum to surrender or German bazookas would level each house in town. The 2nd Battalion was surrounded by five German Infantry Regiments, an artillery battalion, and 600 OCS candidates. But the answer was "No." The fight continued. Snipers fought to the death. Artillery and mortars rained into town. But by 1625 the 2nd Battalion had cleared the town. The 2nd Bn of the 409th Infantry, which was attached to the 410th RCT during the day, was

in the woods to the east occupying the high ground at X 2598, ready for a push at dawn. The 3rd Battalion moved by motor to Gutenberg, opening there at 1120. At 1345 the Battalion pushed on to clear the road from Gutenberg to Grabenstettin, sweeping the woods north of Schlattstall. Company K met resistance on the ridge there while in the woods, and the Battalion held up against an enemy counterattack. It was revealed that OCS candidates fighting in their own maneuver grounds were opposing the Battalion. Late in the period the 3rd Battalion pulled back to the vicinity of Gutenberg. During the day, Congresswoman Claire Booth Luce visited the Regimental CP in Gutenberg.

Division OI 86, dated 241300 April 45, ordered the 103d to continue its present mission to the line Dettingen (X1893)-Munsingen (X3080) with minimum forces and to assemble the remainder of the Division in the Geislingen (S5505) area prepared for further action to the southeast. Attached to RCT 410 were Company B, 328th Engineer Battalion, Company B, 781st Tank Battalion, Company A, 614th TDs, and Company A, 83rd Chemical Mortar Battalion. Upon assembly in Geislingen the Regiment was to be prepared to attack to the southeast, according to OI 87, dated 242100. The 410th was to maintain contact with the elements of the 44th Division on the right (west) and the 409th Infantry on the left (east).

On 24 April 45, the Regiment continued to advance toward the southeast against light opposition. The attached 2nd Battalion of the 409th Infantry attached to the 410th, attacked in the right of the Regimental sector, clearing out the woods, clearing Hulben (X2391) and Urach (X2389). At 0900 the 2nd Battalion moved out southwest, the enemy having withdrawn during the night. The Battalion attacked in the center of the regimental sector, clearing out Grabenstettin, Wingen, and Wittlingen, taking approximately 150 prisoners. The 1st Battalion sent Company B south from Trailfingen at 1250 to capture Munsingen and clear the woods to the right. Aided by tank support, Company B completed the task at 2150, nabbing more than 200 prisoners. Liberated in town were several American prisoners, including one from the 383rd FA who had been ambushed a few nights before. The 3rd Battalion moved out to Bohringen at 0515 to attack from the west. At 0850 the Battalion was attached to the 409th Infantry and at 0945 was ordered to assemble in Bohringen. The CP opened at that town at 1600. However, at 1708 the Battalion was detached from the 409th. As the period closed the Regiment was preparing to move to its new assembly area. The advance CP opened at Urspring (593-968) at 2230.

During the early part of 25 April 45, the RCT was moving to the assembly area southeast of Geislingen (S5504). The 1st Battalion moved out at 1045 to the new area, moving into Zinningen at 1915. Here Task Force May was organized, with Cannon Company, TDs, tanks, and 4.2 mortars attached. The 2nd Battalion left Wittlingen by motor for Urspring at 1150, the battalion arriving there at 1330. However the battalion was ordered to remain on trucks for a move south-east to the Danube River. At 1730 the battalion detrucked at Kesselbron (X6985) moved into Thalfingen, set up a defense of the town, and patrolled the north side of the Danube. The 3rd Battalion closed in at Gutenberg at 0200 and opened at Lonsee at 0445. The CP moved to Westerstetten at 0930, and the rest of the battalion closed in at 1000. At 1200 the attack order was given and at 1315 the battalion started a foot movement, capturing Jungingen (X6685) at 1705.

The battalion sent out patrols to cover the north side of the Danube River. The Regimental CP opened at Jungingen (665-852) at 1800.

Division OI 88, dated 252230 April 45, called for the 103d to cross the Danube at X742-849 and continue its advance southeast. The RCT crossed the Danube on 26 April 45, with the 1st Battalion a motorized task force and the other two battalions on foot, and drove south, meeting only slight resistance. Task Force May moved out of Joningen, crossed the Danube, and swept on through enemy territory. The two battalions on foot mopped up all towns by-passed by the 1st Battalion. From the woods north of Biberach (X8468) a stiff fire fight was encountered. The 1st Battalion closed in that night at Tafertshofen (X8070-8272). The 2nd Battalion moved out of Thalfingen at 1340 to cross the Danube and advanced southeast. At 1600 Finnengen was cleared. At 1820, after Company E had cleared Revetti and Holshwang, and Company G had cleared Neuhäusen and Tifenbach, the battalion reformed and marched to Weiszenhorn, closing there at 2145. The 3rd Battalion moved out at 1230 to cross the bridge. Among the towns it cleared were Steinheim and Holzheim. The Battalion CP opened at Neidhausen at 2130. The Regimental CP opened at Weiszenhorn (8070) at 2015. At the close of the period units had advanced more than 18 kilometers against light opposition.

Division OI 89, dated 270100 April 45, called for the 103d to continue the advance southeast, passing through elements of the 10th Armored Division on the line Buching (D5282)-Saulgrub (D4601)-Riedhausen (D6003). The RCT with its present attachments, was to continue its present mission--seizing the new initial corps objective in the zone (the mountains east of Oberammergau) and block road nets in the vicinity of Partenkirchen (D5282).

The Regiment continued to attack southeast on 27 April 45 with the 1st Battalion leading, the 2nd following on the right, and the 3rd on the left. Numerous horsedrawn equipment was destroyed as multiple columns of the RCT drove southeast approximately 70 kilometers against disorganized regiments. The 1st Battalion moved out at 0545 and advanced so far and so fast it lost contact with regiment. The 2nd Battalion entrucked at 0300 and advanced southeast. At 1100 after a slow but thorough advance the battalion reached the Corps objective and held up in Dirlewang. At 1915, the battalion again moved out on vehicles to continue the advance southeast. At 2000 the battalion held up Baiswell (Y0931) to rest the men and refuel the vehicles. The 3rd Battalion was motorized and moved out at 0300. In the vicinity of Beuchworishofen the battalion captured an enemy hospital including a medical battalion and 4000 wounded enemy soldiers. The Regimental CP moved to Mindelheim (052-422) during the day, opening there at 1330. Then the CP moved to Baiswell (Y0931) at 2100. As the period closed the battalions were reported at the following locations: the 1st at Kaufbeuren, the 2nd at Baiswell, and the 3rd at Schlingen.

The RCT continued its southeasterly attack on 28 April 45. At 0915 the 1st Battalion reached the Lech River at Lechbruch (Y2904) and found both bridges in the zone out. Reconnaissance in the zone during the day brought in more than 500 prisoners but revealed no site at which the river could be crossed.

The 2nd Battalion left Daiswell at 0500 and stopped north of Rosshaupten (D2499) because of the blown bridges. The 3rd Battalion left Bad-Worishem at 0520 and advanced to Bernbeuren (Y2808), also stopping there because the bridges were out. The 1st Battalion set up a CP at Rosshaupten and the 2nd Battalion a CP at Lechbruch (Y2904). The Regimental CP opened at Stotten (215085) at 1215.

Division OI 90, dated 282000 April 45, called for the 103d to continue the advance to the southeast to seize the initial corps objective in the zone, thereafter to continue the advance in the direction Matrei (V0740)-Gries-Am-Brenner (V0930). The Division was to protect the corps left (east) flank until relieved by the 101st Airborne Division and thereafter protect the Corps left (east) flank south of Brenner Pass inclusive. The RCT 410 was to advance rapidly in the zone to Line KK (the main road through Halbleck, east and west), and to initiate immediate and aggressive reconnaissance in its zone to the line MM (main road through Garmison). The bulk of the regiment was to be held in the vicinity of Line KK prepared to continue the advance in its zone.

At 1135 on 29 April 45, the regiment started movement across the Lech River, with the 1st Battalion leading. The 1st Battalion established a CP at Fronretten at 1415. Part of the task force, the battalion AT platoon, one battalion of SP TDs, and one platoon of engineers, moved out by motor for road reconnaissance. Company B outposted Schoberm and the remainder of Company C outposted Reitersan. The 2nd Battalion closed in its assembly area in the vicinity of Buching at 1545. The Battalion reconnoitered and checked towns in the area Herdweg-Hohenschwangen-Fussen-Deutenhausen, and established contact with elements of the 44th Division in Fussen at 2015. The 3rd Battalion closed into Trauchgau at 1600 and the 383rd FA Battalion closed into the vicinity of Berghof at 1600.

The Regimental CP opened at Prem (300045) at 1630. The regimental quartering party captured a brigadier general and his staff of officers in the town. The period ended with the regiment advancing in the rear of Division and conducting reconnaissance to the line MM in accordance with OI 90.

The RCT remained in the area in the vicinity of Prem during the 30th of April 45. The 1st Battalion reconnoitered roads running west from Garmisch and found a road block in the vicinity of the grid square (43-80) heavily mined and manned by dug-in troops. German planes strafed towns in the 1st Battalion area during the day. The 2nd and 3rd Battalions conducted reconnaissance on forward routes but found none through the mountains.
