## HISTORY OF THE 411TH INFANTRY

November 25, 1942.

The 411th Infantry was organized under authority of Section 3 A, National Defense Act approved June 3, 1916 and was constituted a unit of the 103rd Division, organized reserves, with Headquarters in Denver, Colorado, in November 1921.

The Regiment, having been organized after the World War, has no war history.

Colonel Homer C. Washburn, Inf - Res, was the first Regimental commander. He remained in command until 1930.

The distinctive insignia is a half blue and half white divided dancette and indicates the white mountains and blue sky of Colorado. On the shield a rattlesnake is coiled to strike. The Motto is Paratus Ferire (Ready to Strike) and typifies the spirit of the Regiment.

The 411th Infantry was activated November 15, 1942 at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana under the Command of Colonel Donovan P. Yeuell. It is part of the 103rd Infantry Division, commanded by Brigadier General Charles C. Haffner.

The officer Cadre for the 411th was selected in August, 1942 and attended Division Officers Class No 8 at Ft. Benning, Georgia from September 5, 1942 to October 3, 1942. These officers reported to Camp Claiborne October 10, 1942 and received the enlisted Cadre on October 15, 1942 from the 339th Infantry, Camp Shelby, Mississippi. The remainder of the officers reported for duty during the period October 20 - 23, 1942

A period of intensive Cadre training was begun preparatory to receiving troops.

A program of physical training including physical exercises, Jude, and football was begun to harden the officers and non-commissioned officers physically and to teach them methods of training and conditioning their troops upon arrival.

It is the aim of the Regimental Commander to have at the end of the training period - a regiment not only efficient technically and tactically, but so toughened physically and mentally that it will be ready to fight any where, at any time, against any foe.

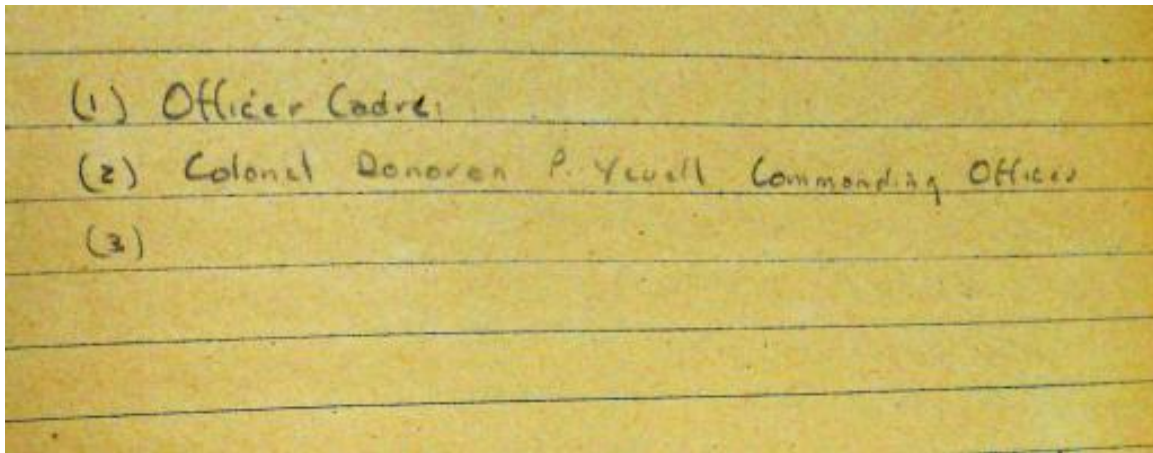
