## James Robert Baldridge

Huron, South Dakota Beadle County December 21, 1925 - November 29, 1944 Killed in Action near Itterswiller, France



Jarres Robert Baldridge was born in Chillicothe, Missouri on December 21, 1925 to Rosetta and Thomas Baldridge. He was raised in Ottumwa, Iowa by his sister Hazel Siegrist Thompson. From 1941 to 1943, he worked in at the Montgomery Wards & Company in Madison, South Dakota. He took temporary employment at John Morrell & Company in Huron, South Dakota until his induction into the service.

Private Baldridge entered the service on March 29, 1944 at Fon Snelling, Minnesota. He was sent overseas on October 6, 1944 to France where he was with Company B, 410<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 103<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Division.

Private James Baldridge perished in Itterswiller, France on November 29, 1944. His name is engraved on a granite obelisk in front of the Huron Public Library, Fluron, South Dakota.
