AWARD OF SILVER STAR

Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star is awarded Technician Third Grade Harold C. Streib, 37400568, Infantry, Company "H", 411th Infantry Regiment, for gallantry in action on 16 November 1944 in the vicinity of * * *, France. Technician Third Grade Streib had been assigned the task of evacuating casualties for Company "H", but when his organization suffered no casualties, he volunteered to perform the same services for another company of the same regiment. Exposing himself to heavy and continuous artillery fire, Technician Third Grade Streib carried the wounded up a mountain side on his back. Twice his first aid kits and pack were shot off, but his efforts were continuous from early in the morning until late at night. When encouraged to rest he refused, redoubled his efforts and went to the aid of wounded men who were out in the open. With utter disregard for his own safety, he repeatedly exposed himself to artillery, mortar and small arms fire in order that he might give aid to these men and prepare them for evacuation. Alone he brought many men up the mountain side, and attended many more on the open field of battle. His magnificent courage was a source of inspiration to all. Entered service from St. Louis, Missouri.

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


