I -- AWARD OF SILVER STAR. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star is awarded to following named individual:

Private First Class Robert L. Blustin, 37548936, Infantry, Company "F", 411th Infantry Regiment. For gallantry in action. On 23 November 1944, near * * *, France, as Company "F", 411th Infantry approached a road junction, Private Blustin, head scout, was fired on by an enemy machine gan. Locating the hostile gan, he volunteered to lead a group in a flanking movement against the position. Three of the men became assualties but Private Blustin advanced alone to a position near the emplacement. He killed the ganner, destroyed the gan and captured several of the enemy. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Duluth, Minnesota.

II -- AWARD OF ERONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:

Private First Class Thomas J. Tomlinson, 42097480, (then Private), Infantry, Company "B", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 21 March 1945, during an attack on * * *, Germany, Company "B", 411th Infantry was advancing through a wooded area, when supporting tanks erroneously fired on our troops. Private Tomlinson, disregarding enemy machine gun fire and the danger of being fired on by friendly tanks, left the shelter of the woods, dashed 175 yards over exposed terrain and succeeded in stopping the tank fire. Frivate Tomlinson's actions, which saved the lives of many comrades, reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Buffalo, New York.

Staff Sergoant Niel E. Classon, 20709903, Infantry, Company "F", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 11 December 1944, near ** *, France, Sergeant Classon, assigned the mission of destroying an enemy machine gun emplacement, cautiously led a five man patrol, unobserved, to the left flank of the hostile position. He then crawled forward, killed the gunner, destroyed the weapon and captured two of the enemy. Sergeant Classon's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Fargo, North Dakota.

FIRST LIEUTEMANT EDWARD D. SCHLAGER, 0548193, Infantry, Headquarters, 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 15 March 1945, near * * *, France, LIEUTEMANT SCHLAGER, although subjected to enemy automatic weapon fire, moved forward through an enemy mine field to coordinate the attack of a company which had been halted by enemy fire. After orienting and instructing the company in the route of advance, he discovered a wounded man lying in a mine field. Disregarding intense mortar barrages falling in the area, he reentered the mine field and as he was evacuating the casualty, he, himself, was severely wounded by a mine. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Port Angeles, Washington.

LIEUTENANT ERIC LUTTEN, French Military Mission Administrative Liaison. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy during the period from 9 November 1944 to 12 March 1945, in France.
