


I -- A TARD OF SILVER STAR. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star is awarded to following named individual:

Private First Class Ira T. McClure, 35813078, Infantry, Company "C", 410th Infantry Regiment. For gallantry in action. On 26 February 1945, during a night raid on * * *, France, when intense enemy machine gun cross fire pinned his patrol to the ground, Private McClure advanced alone through an enemy mine field, located one enemy gun and knocked it out with automatic weapon fire. As the patrol was withdrawing, a comrade was wounded by a mine, and Private McClure in going to his aid was also wounded. In order to prevent further casualties, Private McClure warned the balance of the patrol not to attempt to enter the mine field and guided them around it. Private McClure, remaining in the mine field over night, observed all enemy activities, and when later evacuated, furnished waluable information to his commanding officer. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Leitchfield, Kentucky.

II -- AMARD, FOSTHULOUS, OF SILVER STAR. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star is awarded, posthumously, to following named individuals:

Private First Class Leonard H. Momsen, 37636904, Infantry, Company "C", 410th Infantry Regiment. For gallantry in action. During a night raid on 26 February 1945, the patrol of which Private Momsen was a member was halted at the edge of * * *, France, when the enemy opened fire with a machine gun at point blank range. Private Momsen, picking up a bazooka from a wounded man, made his way through the enemy fire to within 25 yards of the hostile gun, and, firing one round knocked out the gun and killed three of the enemy. Private Momsen's actions, which enabled the patrol to accomplish its mission with a minimum of casualties, reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Kirkwood, Missouri. Next of kin: Mrs. Lucille D. Momsen, (Mother), Rural Route #12, Kirkwood, Missouri.

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00 "89, Hg 103d Inf Div, dtd 24 Mar 45 II - AWARD, FOSTHUMOUS, OF SILVER STAR (Cont'd)

Private First Class John F. Kenney, 20118983, Infantry, Company "C", 410th Infantry Regiment. For gallantry in action. On 26 February 1945, during a night raid on * * *, France, Private Kenney, as scout, was well in advance of his patrol, when enemy automatic weapon fire inflicted several casualties upon the group and pinned them to the ground. Disregarding the enemy fire and the danger of mines, Frivate Kenney advanced alone into the town, located the enemy machine gun, and with well directed rifle fire and hand grenades, knocked out the gun and killed the enemy crew. Frivate Kenney's actions, which enabled the petrol to advance into the town, were in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Roxbury, Massachusetts. Next of kin: Mrs. Margaret Kenney, (Mother), 61 Dudley Street, Roxbury, Massachusetts.

III -- A WARD OF FRONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:


Private First Class Sanford H. Flink, 32974685, Infantry, Company "C", 410th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. During a night raid on 26 February 1945, the patrol of which Private Flink was a member was halted and pinned down at the edge of * * *, Frame, by heavy enemy automatic weapon fire. Disregarding the enemy fire and the danger of mines, Private Flink, advanced alone, located the source of enemy fire, and fired one bazooka round which failed to explode. Remaining in an exposed position, he fired a second round, knocking out the hostile gan and killing four of the enemy. Private Flink's actions, which permitted the patrol to accomplish its mission with a minimum of daualties, reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Brooklyn, New York.

SECOND LIEUTENANT JERRY ". FOCLE, 0547561, Infantry, Company "C", 410th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action, Cn 26 February 1945, LIEUTENANT -POOLE was leading a night patrol through enemy mine fields in the vicinity of
* * *, Frame, when heavy onemy automatic weapon fire forced the group to disperse and seek over. A number of Schu mines were detonated, wounding several
members of the patrol and severely stunning and bruising LIEUTENANT FOOLE. Despite his condition, this officer quickly regained control of his group, reorganized and led them forward. After obtaining valuable information relative to
enemy dispositions, he skillfully withdrew his patrol to friendly lines. LIEUTEMANT FOOLE's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Muskoges, Oklahoma.

IV -- A"ARD, POSTHUMOUS, OF PRONZE STAR NUDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded, posthumously, to following named individual:

Private First Class Joseph D. Christopherson, 37595554, Infantry, Company "C", 410th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 26 February 1945, during a night raid on * **, France, Private Christopherson's squad, moving through enemy mine fields, was pinned down by hostile automatic weapon fire.

Private Christopherson, realizing the precarious position of the patrol, boldly proceeded forward through the mine field picking a path for his comrades. As he reached the edge of the mine field, he was fatally wounded. Private Christopherson's actions, which enabled the patrol to advance enfely, reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Clontarf, Minnesota. Next of kin: Mrs. Christine Christopherson, (Nother), Clontarf, Minnesota.
