I -- AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:

Technician Fifth Grade Roy C. Lawson, 17169468, Infantry, Service Company, 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On the afternoon of 17 November 1944 in the vicinity of \* \* \*, France, an intense encry mortar barrage forced a convoy to halt, and drove the personnel to cover. Technician Lawson, Chaplain's Assistant, observing a wounded comrade lying helpless, crawled fifty yards over extremely mountainous terrain, and disregarding the mortar bursts around him, administered first aid and then carried the wounded man to safety. Technician Lawson's actions in saving the life of a comrade were in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Fort Des Moines, Iowa.

Staff Sergeant Burton A. Mills, 36807964, Infantry, Company "I", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 19 January 1945 in the vicinity of \* \* \*, Frame, heavy enomy pressure forced the Third Battalian, 411th Infantry Regiment to withdraw over open terrain. Sergeant Hills, acting platon sergeant, issued his orders and then remained behind to cover the withdrawal by engaging several enemy machine gun nests. Observing that his men had reached safety, Sergeant Hills withdrew and on his way discovered a wounded commade lying in an exposed position. Disregarding heavy enemy fire he dressed the man's wounds and moved him to a place of safety. Sergeant Mills' actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Beloit, "isconsin.

Corporal Charles A. Shields, 18097130, Infantry, Cannon Company, 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. During the daylight hours of 20 January 1945, in the vicinity of \* \* \*, France, Corporal Shields braved intense enemy fire to lay a vitally needed communication line from a position in Company "G"'s area to a new observation post of his plateon. This task accomplished within 75 yards of the enemy enabled fire missions to be directed on enemy umplacements: which had inflicted several casualties upon adjacent infantry elements. Then mortar shells severed the line in two places,

I -- A ARD OF ERONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:

Technician Fifth Grade Berger L. Johnson, 31193559, Infantry, Company "A", 781st Tank Battalion. For heroism in action. During a dawn attack in the vicinity of \* \* \*, France, on 19 January 1945, the tank, of which Technician Johnson was the driver, received a direct turret hit from an enemy self-propelled gun, wounding the tank commander who fell to the ground. Technician Johnson, disregarding the heavy enemy mortar, machine gun and small arms fire, dismounted and assisted in placing the wounded man on the front slope plate of the tank. He then reentered the tank, turned it around and drove to friendly territory, where the tank commander received immediate medical attention. Technician Johnson's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Norwich, Connecticut.

Corporal John J. Black, 13125875, Infantry, Company "A", 781st Tank Battalion. For heroism in action. During a dawn attack in the vicinity of \* \* \*, France, on 19 January 1945, the tank, of which Corporal Black was a gunner, received a direct turret hit from an enemy self-propelled gun, wounding the tank commander who fell to the ground. Corporal Black, disregarding heavy enemy mortar, mechine gun and small arms fire, dismounted and assisted in placing the wounded man on the front slope plate of the tank. He then aided in holding the injured man in place while the tank was turned around and driven to friendly territory, where the tank commander received immediate medical attention. Corporal Black's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

I -- A MARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:

CARLETON L. REED, Field Director, American Red Cross. For heroic achievement in action. On the night of 3 February 1945, NR. REED voluntarily accompanied elements of the First Pattalion, 41lth Infantry Regiment in a raid on \* \* \*, France, to assist in directing a litter-bearer squad and to provide an added morale factor. When a heavy enemy morter and artillery barrage inflicted numerous casualties upon our troops, NR. REED, disregarding the continuous enemy fire, crawled from one wounded man to another administering first aid and directing their evacuation. On one occasion he carried an injured man 800 yards to an aid station. NR. REED, twice carried wounded men to covered positions from which they were later evacuated. His heroic and unselfish actions under fire aided in saving the lives of several men. Residence: Colchester, Connecticut.

Private Carl R. Fatton, 33756924, Infantry, Company "G", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. During an attack by Company "G" in the vicinity of \* \* \*, France, on 10 January 1945, Frivate Fatton, scout, and his plateon were engaged in a flanking maneuver against an entrenched enemy when automatic weapon fire from a hostile concrete pillbox pinned the men to the ground. "Ithout hesitation, Private Patton crawled over the fire-swept terrain to a better firing position and, although exposed to the enemy, directed accurate fire into the embrasure, materially reducing the hostile fire, and permitting the plateon to resume the attack. Private Fatton's actions were in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: kount Union, Pennsylvania.


