

I -- A"ARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:


CAPTAIN EUGENE D. BLANDFORD, 01319167, Infantry, Headquarters Company, 409th Infantry Regiment. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy during the period 10 November to 2 December 1944, in France. Residence: Fort Arthur, Texas.

Staff Sergeant Herbert Kerman, 36715731, Infantry, Service Company, 409th Infantry Regiment. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy during the period 29 November to 1 December 1944, in France. Residence: Chicago, Illinois.

Corporal Joseph I. Knaebel, 37245893, Field Artillery, Battery "A", 382d Field Artillery Battalion. For heroic achievement in action. On 21 March 1945, near \* \* \*, Germany, when artillery fire was needed on enemy fortified positions in the Siegfried Line, Corporal Knaebel moved through hostile small arms and mortar fire to within 300 yards of enemy positions. Remaining exposed, Corporal Knaebel transmitted fire directions over his radio, enabling the artillery to neutralize the emplacements. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Jefferson City, Missouri.

Technician Fourth Grade Vern A. Yeggy, 37196115, Field artillery, Battery "A", 382d Field Artillery Battalion. For heroic achievement in action. On 21 March 1945, near \* \* \*, Germany, when artillery fire was needed on enemy fortified positions in the Siegfried Line, Technician Yeggy, radio operator, moved through hostile small arms and mortar fire to within 300 yards of enemy positions. Remaining exposed, Technician Yeggy transmitted fire directions, enabling the artillery to neutralize the emplacements. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Riverside, Iowa.

Staff Sergeant George H. Harrison, 36714801, Infantry, Company "D", 409th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 21 March 1945, near \* \* \*, Germany, although detected by enemy observers and subjected to artillery and mortar fire, Sergeant Harrison remained exposed on the crest of a hill to direct

mortar fire on enemy positions. He directed fire into a trench, neutralizing the position, and with one adjustment, destroyed a machine gun emplacement and wounded four of the crew. Observing an anti-tank gun hidden from the road and covering the route of advance of a task force, Sergeant Harrison directed six rounds into the position destroying the gun. Refusing relief, Sergeant Harrison continued to observe throughout the night and detecting blasts from enemy mortars, directed effective fire, which neutralized two positions. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Chicago, Illinois.





I -- AWARD OF ERONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:

Private First Class Lawrence F. Hensley, 34739416, Medical Department, Medical Detachment, 409th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 21 March 1945, near \* \* \*, Germany, an enemy counterattack forced a squad of Company "A", 409th Infantry to withdraw and leave a wounded man behind. Private Hensley, disregarding enemy small arms, automatic weapons and mortar fire, ran and crawled 400 yards over exposed terrain to reach the casualty. Exposed to the enemy fire as well as friendly fire, Private Hensley administered first aid and then moved the wounded man to a place of safety. His actions, in saving the life of a commade, reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Duff, Tennessee.

Private First Class David A. Vraspir, 17109915, Infantry, Company "A", 409th Infantry Regiment. For horoism in action. On 21 March 1945, near \* \* \*, Germany, when a comrade fell wounded, Private Vraspir made his way 150 yards through enemy machine gun and artillery fire to the man's side. Finding the man seriously wounded, he returned over the exposed terrain and, obtaining the aid of three men, again went forward to successfully evacuate the casualty. Private Vraspir's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Hopkins, Minnesota.

Staff Sergeant Ivan M. Current, 37447722, Infantry, Company "I", 409th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 20 March 1945, near \*\*\*, Germany, Sergeant Current led his squad in an attack on a pillbox. "hen rifle-grenade and bazooka fire failed to stop the enemy fire coming from the pillbox, Sergeant Current crawled forward alone, and, disregarding hostile machine gun fire, threw several grenades into the embrasure forcing the occupants to withdraw from the emplacement. Sergeant Current's actions in clearing an enemy strongpoint reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Baldwin, Iowa.

Staff Sergeant Allen A. Johnson, 37321548, Infantry, Company "I", 409th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 20 March 1945, near \* \*\*, Germany, while Sergeant Johnson was leading his squad in the attack a comrade was wounded. Ordering his squad to continue its advance, he remered first aid to the casualty and then rushed back to his squad. Continuing the

attack he shot a sniper who had wounded one of his men. After administering aid to his fallen commade he again moved to the head of his squad and successfully captured his objective. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: St. Paul, Kinnesota.


