Born in Detroit on August 30, 1921, he was raised in nearby Flint, MI.

He married his high school sweetheart, Gloria, in 1940.

George entered service from Flint, MI and reported for basic training at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana on November 28, 1942. He joined the 103d Division, D-Co, 409th Regiment and was later assigned to the Motor Pool under Lieutenant John Lyon. He moved with the Division to Camp Howze, TX in November, 1943. He deployed overseas on the USS Monticello and landed in Marseille, France on October 20, 1944. He drove 6 by 6s and Semis

for the 409th, 1st Battalion. He was grazed by a sniper's bullet but did not report to medical.

Shortly after VE Day, George was transferred to a Chemical Mortar Battalion and was getting ready for duty in the Pacific when the war ended.
